Pon trying; to continue in one's actions or beliefs in spite of problems. The word that is used in Ephesians 6:18 is used in connection with prayer. The theological doctrine of the perseverance of the saints holds that the truly regenerated cannot ever fall away from Christ so as to lose their salvation. Both Calvinists and Armenians seek support for their view in the Scriptures, both sides often using the same passages, but interpreting them differently.

Perseverance is also found in over 20 other scriptures, and Matthew 24:13 describes "endures"—to hold one's ground in conflict, bear up against adversity, hold out under pressure, wait calmly and courageously. It is not passive resignation to fate and mere patience, but the active, energetic resistance to defeat that allows calm and brave endurance. Another word for perseverance is suffering, which is found in over 65 scriptures.

I end with this, "But you, O men of God, flee the things that are opposed to Christ, and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience and gentleness."
