This is a testimonial from Nate Sayre, an inmate here at NCCF. He and I were at dinner talking. While telling me this, I could see that he was speaking from his heart. His testimony brought tears of joy to my eyes, and goose bumps to my arms. I was honored that he shared this with me and I am grateful that he is letting me share it with you.

One day after the cops went to my house, I had to get out of the county. I had some friends who were helping me out. I was real ups. I knew I was going to jail sooner or later. I have one and at the time I had one girl on the way. It was April 11th, and her mother was due on the 25th. So, as we were riding down back roads I was trying to figure to if I was going down the right path. I didn't want to run the rest of my life, but I knew that if I turned myself in I knew it'd be a long time before I'd see my kids, and I really wanted to see and hold my baby girl.

I have always known God, and we've had our share of up's and down's. So, I asked him,

"Lord, I know that I have to do the right thing, but I need to hold my little one first. I don't want to have to leave them behind that's why I am running right now. I need to know if this is the right path-I need some kind of sign."

I never expected what He gave me. There were three of us in the truck, I was in the middle (being the smallest) it was a dreary, cloudy and misty day. I looked to my right, there outside the window was the smallest rainbow I had ever seen. My friend saw the look on my face, and he saw the rainbow too! It started at the mirror and ran along the door (about a foot). Then my friend just

reached out and put his had through it! The three of us watched as we drove down the road, and it just got bigger and bigger until it filled the sky.

I knew right then that that was the answer to my prayer. To this day, I may in prison, but I am on the right path! My grandmother always told me that I was a good person. Now I know what she meant, Bless her heart.—Nate Sayre, NCCF

Toward Clean Speech

1. Recognize swearing does damage. It does not win friends, dates, or jobs. It is not manly
2. Start by eliminating casual swearing. So you're telling a funny story and think that swearing adds emphasis. Pretend granny's listening
3. Think positive. This has been mandated to be included on every self-improvement list for good reason, so quit complaining.
4. Practice patience. Ask yourself when in a long line: Does it really matter?
5. Cope. Consider an annoyance a challenge. Everyone is not perfect like you..!
6. Stop complaining. No one wants to hear it. Read the third tip.
7. Use alternative words. Low-class clods have used these words for centuries. If you must, substitute a less offensive word (only until you can eliminate their need totally).
8. Make your point politely. Poor language choice is not a sign of maturity. How about just saying your idea might work better.
9. Think of what you should have said. See pervious tip.
10. Work at it. Plan ahead for stressful situations or those in which you often swear and develop tricks to stop yourself.

Developed by Jim O'Connor, Chicago, Illinois—Founder of the Cuss Control Academy. Jim says, "Cussing is abrasive, offensive, disrespectful, hostile and, generally, a tool for whiners to further the decline of civility." He also shares, "because we are allowed to express our emotions more openly, we swear. When we get mad, we swear. When we're inconvenienced, we swear. Nobody is trying to deal with those emotions instead." Think about how often you swear because everybody else talks that way.

Remember, just because we are in a prison does not mean we have to lose our self-respect!!!!

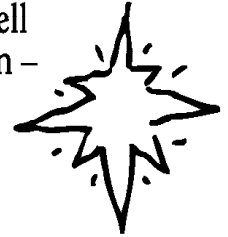
It hardly need be added that the devil's price for discouragement was so high that it was never sold. He still owns it, and is still using it.
