

Thank you and have a heavenly day.


Rising to Perfection

- 16. You're reading this and nodding and laughing.





The Spirit of Tuck

Several years ago, I asked the prisoners that I corresponded with to send me some examples of random acts of kindness. One inmate wrote back, "Random acts of kindness . . . in prison? If you think you see an act of kindness in here, you better look behind you, 'cause somebody's setting you up!"

About three months later, I received a letter from the same disillusioned young man stating, "Remember when you asked me about those acts of kindness? Well, at Christmas, a man they call Tuck gave me a box with all these little partly filled bottles of shampoo, deodorant and nearly a whole bar of soap. These items are precious to us in here. I felt feelings I've never felt before!"

In my first letter from Tuck, he wrote, "I'm trying to change for the better." Tuck was a huge man, only 38 years old, but partially disabled because of medical problems—mostly his heart. It's kind of strange, though, because his heart was huge, kind and loving. Tuck and I wrote for nearly two years steadily, and I grew to love this big man's spirit.

Letters from Tuck invariably included notes from three or four other prisoners from the same facility. The letters often started out with, "Dear Kay, I never could have sent this letter if it weren't for Tuck giving me a stamp."

Tuck's heart was as great as his physical presence. Every prisoner heard Tuck say at least a million times, "If I'd won the lottery, I'd make sure every inmate here would have \$45 a month in his account."

Larry Tucker, an inmate who tried to rise above his past, worked hard to make the present more tolerable. Even with a life sentence, he tried to make the future in prison better for everyone he touched.

Suddenly, in the middle of a dark and lonely night, isolated from help, Larry took his last breath. The entire prison community, including the staff, went into mourning, knowing that Larry didn't have a mean bone in his body. His mother wrote expressing her pain. She and I both saw the best in Larry. The prisoners wrote about their loss, "There was never a better friend than Tuck."
