**THE ANGELUS
&
THE REGINA CAELI**

These prayers are recited three times a day:

- 6 AM, or, early in the morning
- 12 Noon, approximately
- 6 PM, or, early in the evening

The Regina Caeli is recited during the Easter Season, that is, from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday. The Angelus is recited every other day of the year. If a person does it alone, there is no leader and the person says all the prayers him/herself.

The Angelus

Leader: **The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary.**

All: **And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.
Hail Mary....**

Leader: **Behold the handmaid of the Lord.**

All: **Be it done unto me according to thy word.
Hail Mary....**

Leader: **And the Word was made flesh.**

All: **And dwelt among us.
Hail Mary....**

Leader: **Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.**

All: **That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.**

Leader: **Let us pray.**

All: **Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts, that we to whom the Incarnation of Christ, Thy**

Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by His passion and cross be brought to the glory of His resurrection, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Regina Caeli

All: **Queen of heaven, rejoice, Alleluia.**

For He whom thou merited to bear, Alleluia.

**Has risen as He said, Alleluia.
Pray for us to God, Alleluia.**

Leader: **Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary! Alleluia.**

All: **Because our Lord is truly risen, Alleluia.**

Leader: **Let us pray.**

All: **O God, who by the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, has vouchsafed to make glad the whole world, grant we beseech Thee, that, through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may attain the joys of eternal life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The *Angelus* and the *Regina Caeli* are prayers of great joy to commemorate the Incarnation. They go back about a thousand years. They developed in the monasteries and surrounding areas when the bell was rung for prayers, and also from the custom of ringing the church bells at noon to commemorate the crucifixion of our Lord. Church bells are now rung daily at 6 AM, 12 Noon and 6 PM to call those, who would like to do so, to pray the *Angelus* or, in the Easter Season, the *Regina Caeli*.
