HEAR NOW is a national program of the Starkey Hearing Foundation, which provides assistance to those in need of hearing aids but who are unable to afford them. The applicant is responsible for the evaluation, small program fee and the cost of batteries and repairs. Once qualified, an applicant will receive a hearing aid without any other costs.
