1. Holy water fonts at the entrances of the Church will be dry.
2. At the Sign of Peace, people should bow to one another instead of shaking hands, or, they may simply say, "Peace be with you" to one another.
3. Drinking from the Chalice at Communion will be discontinued.
4. People with any cold or flu-like symptoms should receive Communion in the hand, instead of on the tongue.
