

THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS is tomorrow, Nov. 1st. It is a holy day, but this year, because it falls on a Monday, it is not a holy day of obligation. There will, however, be a special Mass at 6:00 PM Monday, for all who can make it.

ALL SOULS DAY – This Tuesday, Nov. 2nd, is All Souls Day, the day on which the Church prays for all the souls in purgatory. And on that day, Christians everywhere are encouraged to pray, as well, for their own loved ones who have died, in order to speed their way to heaven, in case they are not yet there.

Everyone is invited to come to our very special All Souls Day Mass at 7:00 PM that day. At that Mass, the names of all parishioners who will have died in the previous 10 years will be slowly read out. Then there will be a long moment of silence for people to whisper the names of other relatives and friends of their own who have died.

The Mass will then be offered for all those whose names have been read out or whispered.



LIST OF NAMES – The list of the deceased members of St. Malachy's Parish whose names are to be read out at the All Souls Day Mass is on the writing board in the vestibule of the Church.

This list was compiled from our funeral record book. Therefore, only members of the Parish whose funerals were held at St. Malachy's are included in this list.


Anyone who knows of a member of the Parish whose funeral took place elsewhere between the years 2000-2010, is invited to write his/her name on the list, along with the approximate date of his/her death. Only those who were actual members of the Parish or had a quasi-domicile here are to be included.

ALL SOULS DAY ENVELOPES may be put into the collection at any time between now and the end of November, the month dedicated to prayer for the souls in purgatory. Masses will be offered throughout the coming year collectively for all those whose names have been written on the All Souls envelopes.

SAINT MALACHY'S SENTINEL

- On the night before he died, Jesus said to his three closest disciples, "Watch with me".
- A Catholic Church is a holy place because of the presence of the Holy Eucharist in the tabernacle and because it is the place where the mystical Body of Christ gathers to worship God.
- In order to make St. Malachy's Church even more a house of prayer and to call down even more abundant graces on our parish and world, we would like to invite people to become sentinels.
- A sentinel is a person who promises to spend one half hour of prayer in the church each month. They may pray a Psalm or other prayer, they may pray the Rosary, or they may pray in any other way they choose.
- It does not have to be the same day or the same time each month. The church is open from 7:00 AM until at least 7:00 PM each day.
- If you would like to become a St. Malachy's sentinel, please sign up in the vestibule.
- The sentinels will begin their half hour watches this November. A brief, orientation meeting for sentinels will be held after each Mass next weekend, Nov. 6th/7th, in the church. They may attend any one of the three meetings.
