- ♥ 40 Days for Life, which began in Texas, is a national campaign which has been done eight times since 2007. People of faith and conscience in 357 cities across all 50 of the United States, Canada, Australia, England, Northern Ireland and Denmark have participated.
- ♥ 40 Days for Life brings together the Body of Christ in a spirit of unity during a focused 40 day campaign of prayer, fasting and peaceful witness with the purpose of turning hearts and minds from a culture of death to a culture of life.
- ♥ 40 Days for Life has had great success in saving babies, sparing women and men from the tragic effects of abortion including a lifetime of regrets, and converting abortion workers.
- ♥ The ninth national 40 Days for Life Campaign is now underway (Sept 28-Nov 6). The Syracuse vigil location is in front of Planned Parenthood, 1120 E. Genesee Street. You don't have to participate every day of the 40 days, only as many days as you can, even once.

THE DREAM ACT - Many illegal immigrants looking for work brought their infants and children with them into the United States. These children have grown up attending our schools. Thousands of these young people, many of whom have worked very hard, would now like to go to college and pursue the American dream, but they are in danger of being deported back to the countries from which their parents came.

The Dream Act would give these students who have graduated from high school in the U.S. an opportunity to earn legal status and citizenship through higher education or military service.

The Dream Act would also give this opportunity to illegal immigrants who have children who are U.S. citizens, that is, children who were born in this country.
