Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A very old American proverb states: "It doesn't work to leap a twenty-foot chasm in two ten-foot jumps." I encourage you to keep those wise words in mind as I share with you some exciting news about our church.

At the beginning of this calendar year, a dedicated group of people began meeting at the behest of session and worked under the banner of Christian Education Task Force. Their duties were to look at the Christian education program and decide what was working well and what needed to be changed in order to improve what the church offers to our members. The Task Force organized themselves quickly and efficiently evaluated what was in place and many different structures and offerings that might work even better. After several months of hard work and in consultation with the Worship Committee, they brought to session an entirely new Sunday worship and study design for consideration. Some of the concerns they considered in their deliberations were as follows:

- While most people like the content of the rotational program, there was the feeling that the absence of a recognizable teacher (or teachers) for each age group reduced the development of relationships between teachers and pupils.
- Even when the teachers of each section of study were rotated, there were still many teachers and support staff that were rarely able to attend worship.
- There was no adult Christian education on Sunday morning.

The Task Force soon became aware that there was no way to restructure the Christian education program without restructuring all of Sunday morning. Many discussions were held about how to redesign the morning without causing total disruption of what we presently have.

I believe the Task Force brought a very workable design to session, and it was apparent that session also agreed, since they approved the plan unanimously. It should also be understood that we will be monitoring the changes carefully to see how everything works. During the start of each step of the program, we would like for all of you to share your thoughts about what is working, what might be changed to improve the design, and what you feel is not working at all. Here is the design and the steps we are going to take to implement the new program:

- In August, we will start a new worship service at 8:30 a.m., and the second service will start at 10:30 a.m. (only one half hour later than the service starts now). A coffee hour will be held in the time between the two services for those leaving the first service and those coming to the second service.
- ➤ In September, Christian education <u>for all ages</u> will take place between the two worship services from 9:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.
- ➤ We are hoping to have an open coffee hour from 9:15 a.m. through shortly after the second worship hour.

I know that there are many more details that need to be worked out, and I can assure you that the Task Force and the session are working on them. We will continue to update you and keep you informed through the bulletin and newsletter. Two other items of exciting news I have to share with you and connected to these changes are:

- □ Elder Susan Pierce has taken the position of Director of Christian Education.
- Seminarian Starr Tomczak, a second-year student at Union Seminary, will start in September as our student intern to support the areas of Christian education and youth fellowship. I will be sharing more about Starr with you in the near future, but let me leave you with this: I am delighted that Starr has accepted the position we offered. After a successful career as an attorney, she left the practice of law to pursue a call to the ministry. She brings wonderful gifts to us, and I know that where she is involved, she will bring strong faith, keen insight, and a willing spirit.

# It All Started with a Book Prayer Shawl Ministry (PSM) Notes

For those of you who read the Tower Tie last month, you noticed that (in the piece done by the Times Herald Record) this ministry started when Darlene Bartley read a Debbie Macomber book called *Back on Blossom Street*. The book is one in a series about things that happen in the shops on a small street called Blossom Street. This book deals with the making of prayer shawls. Many of us were Debbie Macomber fans to begin with, and when Darlene suggested this, she didn't have to ask twice.

The article and several other things that have happened to the shawl group were sent to Mrs. Macomber in the state of Washington. By "things" I mean paragraphs from the wonderful letters of thanks for the shawls the people have received. We were also blessed by a very generous donation for the group to continue buying yarn so more people will have the feeling that they are cared for and loved during difficult or happy times in their lives. Debbie's book has come full circle. The shawl group has a copy of the book, which we are passing around if anyone in the congregation would like to read it. Debbie Macomber was so impressed with our story that she wrote to one of the members of our group for some further details (no last names of course) so she can use our story in her Key Note Address at the Stitches convention in Illinois this coming August. (Stitches is a well known knitters convention.) We are hoping that someday in the future we will entice her to come to the Hudson Valley and maybe use our church for one of her book signings. She mentioned that she would like to meet the members of our prayer shawl ministry. Debbie's newest book is called *Knit Together*, which deals with her life story and Psalm 139. I highly recommend it.


