

## PASTOR'S MESSAGE Just Do it! For Jesus: Serving God and Serving Others As Away of Life

Sometimes they are the quiet ones, hardly noticed, remaining in the background. They are the ones who are "just there" volunteering their time, helping to make this world a better place.

They are the first ones to help set up tables, serve food, help with the kids, bring food to the food shelf or a neighbor or work on mission events. They are givers rather than takers, and there is a big difference between the two. The difference is shown in their attitude toward people and toward the purpose of their lives.

I have a statement that I keep near me on my desk, it was written by Helen Keller and it says this:

#### Many persons have a wrong idea of what constitutes true happiness. It is not attained through self-gratification but through fidelity to a worthy purpose.

True happiness and joy are not achieved through the attainment of things that are tangible but through the intangible—a legacy of love and compassion, of helping others. For Christians, our "worthy purpose" is living out the gospel, the "Good News" through our words and deeds. When Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment was, he said, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself."

True happiness is also not achieved through selfcentered lives. One of Jesus' main themes in loving our neighbor is that of service. "The first shall be last and the last shall be first." Martin Luther said we are to be slaves of no one but servants of all. This does not mean being walked over or not standing up for justice for you or for others. Some of the greatest Christian leaders such as Martin Luther, William

Wilberforce, Dietrich Bonheoffer and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. expressed their faith through the pursuit of justice. One thing it does mean for all of us is being good stewards—giving God what he first gave us—out time, our talent, and money.

There are many ways to live out servanthood in our church and in our community. Just look around. Ask how you can be involved. If you are not "giving back" or "paying it forward" through service, this new year of 2013 may be a time of new beginnings. If your life feels empty and without meaning, you need to be involved in a worthy purpose—not in order to earn your way to heaven (we are saved by grace through faith) but in order to live our your faith in your daily life. Martin Luther said that one's outside actions reflect the inside state of one's soul. It's time to get involved! Just do it!

A motion was made by Peggy Starz and second by Sheryl Stranberg to accept the Financial Reports of the Marv Otto/Immanuel Trust Fund, Women of ELCA, Education Fund, Youth Group, Memorial Fund and Hermena Carly Trust and Organ Repair Loan. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Larry Stranberg and second by Ernie Frarck to accept the Statistics and Memorial Reports as printed in the Annual Report. Motion passed unanimously.

There was no old business.

In new business we received an update on the call committee by chair Ernie Frarck.

A motion was made by Veda Stockland and second by Pat Walsh to nominate Paula Pistulka as congregational secretary.

Closing Prayer was led by Pastor Kathy Hartley.

A motion was made and second to adjourn the 145th Annual meeting of Immanuel Lutheran Church. Motion passed unanimously.

# THANK YOU

#### To the Distinguished Members of Immanuel Lutheran,

On the morning of December 28th, I awoke to what would become the most directly life altering day of my short life. Within 20 minutes of hitting my alarm, I was left to watch everything I own ignite in flames, turning to ash the only place I have called home since becoming an "adult" (let that be a lesson to never hit the Snooze!). Each day since has brought a reminder of something I will never see again, from 4th grade basket-ball jerseys to college acceptance letters to a repository of Happy Birthday cards from my grandmother, Rocile. However, my most chilling realization has been tied to the things I cannot remember owning in the first place. Our closets were packed full of mementos, pictures, cards, and other things kept to recollect a fond experience or important chapter of my life. But there were so many of these things that without them in my sight to jog my memory, the attachments I had to them will evaporate as quickly as the smoke that morning.

I bring this up to relay the limited importance of "stuff," and why that day was so life changing for me. In my time as a member of this fine Church, I have listened to countless sermons and Sunday School lessons regarding the exaggerated importance of possessions in our lives. This notion never became real to me until I lost all of mine... and was left having to take a personal inventory of what I still had; what I found was more than I ever could have realized before that morning. Put simply, the fire did not ruin my friendships, it did not burn my warmest memories, and it did not evaporate my faith in people being good. And this last point is key.

My biggest take away from the fire was not my phone or the jacket I grabbed as I ran out. It was the realization that if you give your neighbors, family, friends, and community a reason to do good things, they will support you above and beyond what could ever be expected. In the two weeks that have followed, I have had members from this community (some of whom I haven't seen in years) lend a place to stay, a pair of shoes,



a few kind words, and an offer that they will do whatever it takes to help. My take away has been realizing that possessions are indeed just "stuff," replaceable things that are simply meant to help us in our daily lives. And when you accumulate too much of it, you can't even remember it all (which blinds you from seeing the things you've had all along, the things inflammable to even the hottest fires).

I feel the deepest sense of gratitude for the donation the church collected after hearing about my troubles, and it will go a long way to helping me get back to a more normal way of living. However, the Church providing me the most basic feeling of support from our congregation and the surrounding community, from the good deeds offered to the endless words of encouragement, has been truly remarkable and irreplaceable . More than anything else, this experience has shown me that roast beef suppers are not simply a means of revenue, and that quilts are not merely sold for warmth. The brotherhood and sisterhood of our community, the emotional support of when one falls we all fall, when one hurts we all hurt, invigorates a faith that people are good, and it has reminded me of why we do the things we do for each other. I cannot thank the Church enough for your blessings, prayers, and donations, and I can only hope this experience has helped others like myself see what truly is important...something that no fire can take away.
