# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

### The Least of These...

The image of "the least of these" in Matthew 25 came to mind in the past weeks as I was reminded about how difficult it can be for us to connect and relate to those who are different from us.

Fourteen years ago, I began working in ministry as a youth director for 6th-12th graders at a Lutheran church in St. Paul. The church had a long standing youth ministry, so when I came in things were flourishing and growing and I was able to simply build on the firm foundation already laid. However, an interesting thing happened. Within six months, the faces of the "regulars" at youth group increased and changed.

A few of the students were not only different kids, but they looked and acted different. You see, the Goth style of dress (black clothing, dog collars, chains, black lipstick & nail polish, big holed earrings, etc.) was just hitting its peak at the time. So instead of high school students in jeans, t-shirts or polo shirts – there were many students that looked menacing, scary, and mischievous (yes, true comments that I heard from other members).

In reality, some of these students were some of the most committed Christian teens I had ever met. One of them, Josh, commented to me, "Sure, I dress like this because I want to be different; I want to be set apart – isn't that what the word holy means anyways?

"Jesus told us not to conform to the world around us — that's what I try to do with my actions and words. Yeah — and maybe my dress, too (smirk). But I also do it because I don't want to buy in to all the hype around clothing, labels, and stereotypes.

"Whenever I walk into a store or restaurant, all the adults' eyes are on me, concerned that I am the druggie or the kid with the messed up priorities and values. When in reality, at my school, it's lots of the preppy kids with money who 'look the part: together and respectable' – it's those kids who are doing the drugs and partying. Yet, no one questions them simply because of their outer look. Now that's messed up."

At sixteen, Josh was wise beyond his years about life, faith, and how the world works. When Josh became active in our youth group — initially he was shunned a bit because he was different. And I have to admit, my inner thoughts about him were judgmental, too. But soon, students were willing to look past the exterior and see Christ inside of Josh.

In the 25th chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus speaks about the "least of these." "Who are the least of these?" you might ask. Well, Jesus' disciples and followers wondered the same thing. Jesus defined "the least" in the Parable of the Sheep & the Goats: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me (v. 35-36)."

In the parable the sheep and the goats all ask Jesus, "When did we see you hungry, thirsty, sick, in prison, or without clothing?" Jesus replied to each, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me," and "Whatever you did NOT do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me (v.40 & v.45)."

Jesus tells this parable as an example of God's judgment both in this life and the next. In essence, this is how Jesus explains how we will be judged... by how we treat our family, friend, neighbor, stranger, and yes, even our enemy.

Was Josh one of the least of these? He wasn't physically hungry or thirsty or unclothed – but he did hunger and thirst for the Living God and the community of God's people. He wanted to be free from the prison of our earthly stereotypes and ways we judge each other.

Fortunately for the congregation in St. Paul, the teens got over their issues of outer appearances pretty quickly. It did take the adults a bit longer. I always think – what would have happened if we had closed the door on Josh?

In this Scripture, Jesus looks into our hearts, our attitudes, and our actions towards those around us. Who are the least of these around us? Who are the least of these in your life? Is it truly someone in need of food, shelter, or clothing? Or is it someone in need of compassion, forgiveness, grace, mercy, or understanding? In what ways have you nourished Christ in someone around you? Or — in what ways have you refused to see Jesus within someone in your life or surroundings?

Was Josh one of the least of these? Absolutely! Yet – aren't we all?

That is the absolute, overflowing good news of the Living God in Christ Jesus! We are all the least of this – hungry, thirsty, naked, needy and imprisoned, and God in Christ feeds, nourishes, clothes, and FREES us with forgiveness, love, mercy, and grace.

As Martin Luther said, we are all beggars at the foot of God's door, at the foot of the cross. Now let's tell another beggar where we found bread.
