

He Came in His Father's Name

"I have come in My Father's Name, and you do not receive Me. If another shall come in his own name, him you will receive. How can you believe, who receive honor one from another, and seek not the honor that comes from God only? Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father; for there is one who accuses you, even Moses, in whom you trust. For had you believed Moses, you would have believed Me; for he wrote about Me. **But if you do not believe his writings, how shall you believe My words?**" (John 5:43-47)

I Have Come: from the Greek words *ergo* & *elelytha* which mean: I have-come; from *erchomai* which means: came, to come, to go, coming, going, etc.. To come or go from one place into another; and used both of persons arriving, going, and returning. In context: Jesus has come to Earth, from Heaven, in the Name of His Father, who has sent Jesus to be the Savior of the World.

in: from the Greek word *en* which mean: in, on, at, by, with, among; most commonly "in" as in "inside" of something; or "in the name" of someone or something. In context: Jesus is coming in the Name of His Father who abides in Heaven.

My: from the Greek words *mou* a personal pronoun which means: of-me, or my; or mine; In context: belonging to or associated with the speaker - who is Jesus, and is speaking specifically of His Father in Heaven; with the added emphasis of coming in His Name.

the Father's: from the Greek word *tou* & *patros* which mean: of-the father; from *pater* which means: a father; and refers to the male begetter, originator, progenitor of children; and thus someone in intimate connection and relationship with his child (children); and who passes on to his children unique physical characteristics, and teaches and leads his children in his ways; or in context: spiritual characteristics. The context is: God Most High is the confessed Father of Jesus; who has been sent in the Name of the Father, by the Father, being taught by the Father, and equipped by the Father to be the Savior of the World.

the Name: from the Greek words *to* & *onomati* which mean: the Name; from *onoma* which means: a name, character, fame, reputation, authority, cause; the name by which a person or a thing is called, and thus distinguished from others. Or, being *par excellence* - the best of a kind: the Name above all names! "Figuratively: the manifestation or revelation of someone's character, i.e. as distinguishing them from all others." In context; **the Name of God the Father** - and all that His name implies. ["According to Hebrew notions, a name is inseparable from the person to whom it belongs, i.e. it is something of his essence. Therefore, in the case of the God, **it (His Name)** is specially sacred (Holy)" (Souter)]

Literally: "I have-come in the Name of-the Father of-Me."

Jesus came in His Father's Name! So what can be said of the Name of God the Father. Please consider the following:

"And Moses said unto God, 'Behold, when I come unto the children of Israel, and shall say unto them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me unto you;' and they shall say to me, 'What is His name?' - what shall I say unto them?' And God said unto Moses, '**I AM** (ehyah) **WHO** (that) **I AM** (ehyah);' and He (God) said, 'Thus you shall say unto the children of Israel, '**I AM** (ehyah) has sent me unto you.' And God said moreover unto Moses, 'Thus you shall say unto the children of Israel, **Yahweh** (The **LORD**) God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me unto you; **this is My Name forever**, and this is My Memorial (Name) unto all generations.'" (Exodus 3:13-15)

He Came in His Father's Name

I AM: from the Hebrew word ***ehyah*** a verb which means: I-am; referring to the state of existence, or the state of being of the one speaking. (from ***hayah*** which means: to be, to exist, to become.) In context: the One who Is, or **the One who Is the eternally Self-existing omniscient, omnipotent, omnipresent Supreme Being** has sent Moses to the children of Israel.

LORD (YHWH = YHVH): the proper name of God, the God of Israel. Phonetically pronounced either 'Yah-weh' or 'Yeh-ho-vaw' depending on translator preference. Various meanings: the one bringing into being, life-giver, giver of existence, or Creator. But most take it as **"the One who is"** in the sense of being **the absolute and unchangeable One**, the self-existing One, the ever living one, as in being self-consistent and unchangeable eternally,

This name of God also encompasses all the nature and character of who God is. Please consider the following quotes from the Book of Psalms:

"**O Yahweh** (O LORD) our Lord, **how excellent** is Your Name in all the earth; who has set Your glory above the heavens. **O Yahweh** (O LORD) our Lord, **how excellent** is Your **Name** in all the earth!" (please read Psalm 8:1-9)

"His Name shall endure forever. His Name shall be continued as long as the sun; and men shall be blessed in Him; all nations shall call Him Blessed. Blessed be Yahweh (the LORD) God, the God of Israel, who only does wondrous things. And blessed be His Glorious Name forever; and let the whole earth be filled with His glory; Amen, and Amen (i.e. Truly, and Truly)." (Psalm 72:17-19)

"Fill their faces with shame; so that they may seek **Your Name, O Yahweh** (O LORD). Let them be confounded and troubled forever; yes, let them be put to shame, and perish; so that *they* may know that You, **whose Name alone is Yahweh** (the LORD), **are the Most High (God) over all the Earth.**" (Psalm 83:16-18)

"I will extol You, my God, O King; and I will bless **Your Name** forever and ever. Every day I will bless You; and I will praise **Your Name** forever and ever. **Great is Yahweh** (the LORD), and greatly to be praised; and **His greatness is unsearchable**. **My mouth shall speak the praise of Yahweh** (the LORD); and let all flesh **bless His Holy Name forever and ever.**" (please read Psalm 145:1-21)

"... Let them praise **the Name of Yahweh** (the LORD): for He commanded, and they were created. Let them praise **the Name of Yahweh** (the LORD): for **His Name alone is excellent; His glory is above the earth and heaven.**" (please read Psalm 148:1-14)

Our title, "He came in His Father's Name" implies a "Sender" - who is of course God the Father. It is the Father who, in His Name, appointed and sent Jesus to preach the Good-News of Deliverance and Salvation to the people; and to achieve that deliverance and salvation through His sacrificial death on the Cross of Calvary. Please consider the following:

"And He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up; and, as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read. And there was delivered unto Him the Book of the prophet Isaiah. And when He had opened the book, He found the place where it was written, *'The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He (God the Father) has anointed Me to preach the Good-news to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are bruised, and to preach the acceptable year of the Lord.'* And He closed the book, and He gave it again to the minister, and sat down. And the eyes of all those who were in the synagogue were fixed on Him. And He began to say unto them, **Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.**" (Luke 4:16-21) (quote is from Isaiah 61:1-2)

Jesus had more to say in regards to being sent in the Father's Name:

"I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not My own will, **but the will of the Father who has sent Me.**" (John 5:30)

"I have many things to say and to judge of you: **but He (the Father) who sent Me is true; and I speak to the world those things which I have heard from Him.**" (John 8:26)

"And **He who sent me is with Me; the Father has not left Me alone;** for I do always those things that please Him." (John 8:29)

"Jesus cried and said, 'He who believes on Me, believes not on Me (only), but on **Him (the Father) who sent Me. And he who sees Me sees Him who sent Me.**'" (John 12:44-45)

"For I have not spoken from Myself; but **the Father who sent Me,** He gave Me a commandment, as to what I should say, and what I should speak." (John 12:49)

"Truly, truly, I say unto you, He who receives whomsoever I send receives Me; and he who receives Me **receives Him (the Father) who sent Me!**" (John 13:20)

He was sent in the Father's Name **to be the propitiation for our sins!** (I John 4:10)

He was sent in the Father's Name **so that we might know Jesus the Christ!** (John 17:3)
He was sent in the Father's Name **so that we might live through Him!** (I John 4:9)

Finally, please consider the testimony of John the Baptist:

"**He who comes from above** is above all; he who is of the earth is earthly, and speaks of the earth. **He who comes from Heaven (from the Father)** is above all. And what He has seen and heard, that He testifies; and no man receives His testimony. He who has received His testimony has set to his seal that God is true. For He (speaking of Jesus) **whom God has sent** speaks the words of God; for God does not give the Spirit by (limited) measure unto Him (Jesus). **The Father loves the Son, and has given all things into His hand.** He who believes on the Son has Everlasting Life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see Life; but the wrath of God abides on him." (John 3:31-36)
