"Moreover, brethren, I declare unto you the Gospel (the Good-news) which I preached unto you, which also you have received, and in which you stand; through which also you are saved, if you keep in memory what I preached unto you, unless you have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ Died for Our Sins According to the Scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He Rose Again the third day According to the Scriptures. And that He was seen by Cephas (Peter), then by the twelve (apostles). After that, He was seen by above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep (i.e. physically died). After that, He was seen by James; then by all the apostles. And last of all He was seen by me also, as of one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who is not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God." (I Corinthians 15:1-3-9)

**Christ:** from the Greek word <u>Christos</u> which means: <u>Anointed-one</u>; the same as the Hebrew word for Messiah; both of which mean: the Anointed-One: referring to God's promised Messiah Deliverer and Savior - used here by Paul <u>as an exclusive title</u> of Jesus. Also, a title for Jesus first used by an angel, of God, speaking to Daniel the prophet:

"Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the **Messiah the Prince** shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks; the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times. And after threescore and two weeks **the Messiah shall be** <u>cut off</u> (through His death on the <u>Cross</u>)."(Daniel 9:25-26)

**Died:** from the Greek word <u>apethanen</u> (<u>apo-thnesko</u>) a verb which means: <u>died</u>; or to-die-off; with the emphasis being the 'separation' that occurs as a result of dying; as in physical separation from the land of the living through death. Or as separation from God through sin caused spiritual death. Jesus paid the ransom price for our salvation by dying on the Cross as our sacrificial Lamb of God; also He suffered a type of spiritual death, and separation from God the Father, when He took upon Himself the sins of sinful people. It is as He cried out while hanging in pain upon the Cross:

"My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" (Matthew 27:46) (a brief separation from the Father)

**for Our:** from the Greek word <u>hemon</u> which means: <u>of-us</u>, or <u>for-our</u>; in context: Paul is speaking of <u>all followers</u> of Jesus, who have believed that Jesus did indeed die for their salvation, and for forgiveness from sin, and from sin's eternal consequences - which is <u>separation</u> from God - Most Holy!

**Sins:** from the Greek word <u>ha-martion</u> a noun which means: <u>sins;</u> from **a-martia** - a sin, a fault, whether it occurs by omission or commission, in thought and feeling, or in speech and action; a sinful deed that thus causes a <u>separation</u> from God, and thus a loss of perfect holiness; thus missing the mark of God's perfect holiness; and thus resulting in a life being <u>not-a-part</u> (<u>a-meros</u>)' of fellowship with God the Father! As it says:

"But <u>your iniquities have separated</u> you from your God, and your sins <u>have hidden His face from you</u>, so that He will not hear." (<u>Isaiah 59:2</u>)

**According to:** from the Greek word <u>kata</u> which means: according-to. In context: done or fulfilled according to the prophetic Word of God as written down the within the sacred scriptures <u>prior</u> to the First Coming of Christ Jesus.

**the Scriptures:** from the Greek words <u>tas graphas</u> which mean: <u>the scriptures</u>; in context: the Holy Scriptures: the inspired (by God), inerrant <u>writings</u> of the Bible. In context: referring to specific scriptural prophecies foretelling the crucifixion and death of Jesus for the forgiveness of the sins that separate people from Holy fellowship with God.

Christ Died for Our Sins According to the Scriptures: Please consider these prophesies:

"He is despised and rejected by men; a Man of Sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and we hid as it were our faces from Him; He was despised, and we esteemed Him not. Surely He has borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows; yet we did esteem Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions. He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed. We all like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity (sins) of us all. He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth. He was brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He opened not His mouth. ... for He was cut off out of the land of the living; for the transgression of my people He was stricken. And He made His grave with the wicked, and with the rich in His death; because He had done no violence, neither was any deceit in His mouth. Yet it pleased the LORD (Yahweh God) to bruise Him; He has put Him to grief; when You shall make His soul an offering for sin, ... by His knowledge shall My Righteous Servant (Jesus) justify many (people); for He shall bear their **iniquities**. Therefore will I divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong; because He has poured out His soul **unto death**; and He was numbered with the transgressors; and He bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors. " (Isaiah 53:3-12)

"I am poured out like water, and all My bones are out of joint; My heart is like wax; it has melted in the midst of My bowels. My strength is dried up like a potsherd; and My tongue cleaves to My jaws; and You have brought Me into the dust of death. For dogs have encompassed Me; the assembly of the wicked have inclosed Me. They pierced My hands and My feet. I may tell all My bones; and they look and stare upon Me. They part My garments among them, and cast lots upon My coat." (Psalm 22:14-18)

"You have known My reproach, and My shame, and My dishonor. My adversaries are all before You. Reproach has broken My heart; and I am full of heaviness; and I looked for some to take pity, but there was none; and for comforters, but I found none. They gave Me also gall for My food; and in My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink." (Psalm 69:19-21)

"And one shall say unto Him, 'What are these wounds in Your hands?' Then He shall answer, 'Those with which I was wounded in the house of My friends.' Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd (the Father's shepherd Jesus), and against the Man who is My Associate, says the LORD of Hosts; Strike the Shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered; and I will turn My hand upon the little ones." (Zechariah 13:6-7)

<u>Christ Died</u> for Our Sins According to the Scriptures: Please consider the following:

## The Prophetic fulfillment - The Crucifixion - a Harmony:

(see the <u>Cross Story</u>: see also: Matthew 27:33-56; Mark 15:22-41; Luke 23:33-49; John 19:17-30)

"And they arrived at the place, which is called Golgotha ... And there they crucified Jesus, ... And Pilate wrote a title, and put it on the cross. And the writing was JESUS OF NAZARETH THE KING OF THE JEWS. ..... After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, and so that the scripture might be fulfilled, He said, "I thirst." Now there was setting nearby a vessel full of vinegar; and immediately one of them ran and filled a sponge with vinegar, and put it upon a reed, and put it to His mouth to drink. And the rest said, "Let be; and let us see whether Elijah comes to take Him down and save Him." When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, He said, "It is finished." And Jesus, crying again with a loud voice, said, "Father into your hands I commend My Spirit;" and having said this He bowed His head, and yielded up His Spirit." (see scripture references above)

Christ Died for Our Sins According to the Scriptures: Please consider the following:

"My little children, these things I write unto you, so that you do not sin. And if any man sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the Righteous. And He is the Propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for the Whole World." (see 1 John 2:1-5)

"But God, who is rich in mercy, for His great Love with which He Loved us; even when we were dead in sins, has made-alive us together with Christ; by Grace you are saved; and has raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus; so that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us through Christ Jesus. For by Grace you are saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:4-10)

"You know that <u>you were not redeemed with corruptible things</u>, such as silver and gold, from your vain conduct received by tradition from your fathers; <u>but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a Lamb without blemish</u> and without spot (i.e. as without sin); who truly was foreordained before the foundation (creation) of the world, but was manifested in these last times for you; who through Him do believe in God, who <u>raised Him up from the dead</u>, and gave Him Glory; so that your faith and hope might be in God." (1 Peter 1:18-21)

"He (Jesus) committed no sin, and no deceit was found in His mouth. When they heaped abuse on Him, He did not retaliate; when He suffered, He made no threats, but entrusted Himself to Him (the Father) who judges justly. He Himself (Jesus) bore our sins in His body on the tree (the Cross), so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. "By His stripes you are healed: (1 Peter 2:22-24)

"But Christ ... through His own blood (His death) He entered in once into the Holy Place, having obtained eternal redemption for us. For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies to the purifying of the flesh; how much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? (see Hebrews 9:11-15)

"But **God commends** <u>His Love towards us</u>, in that, <u>while we were yet sinners</u>, <u>Christ died</u> <u>for us</u>. Much more then, being now <u>justified in His blood</u>, <u>we shall be saved from wrath through Him</u>. For if, when we were enemies, <u>we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son</u>, <u>much more</u>, <u>being reconciled</u>, <u>we shall be saved in His life</u>. (<u>Romans 5:8-10</u>)
