"For unto which of the angels said He (the Father) at any time, 'You are My Son, this day have I begotten You?' (Psalm 2:7) And again, 'I will be to Him a Father, and He shall be to Me a Son?' (see 2 Samuel 7:8-14-17) And again, when He brings in the First-Born (Jesus) into the world, He says, 'And let all the angels of God worship Him (Psalm 97:7). But unto the Son (Jesus) (He, the Father says), 'Your Throne, O God (speaking of Jesus), is forever and ever; a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your Kingdom. You have loved righteousness, and hated iniquity; therefore God, even Your God, has anointed You with the oil of gladness above Your fellows (disciples) (Psalm 45:6-7).' " (Hebrews 1:5-9)

Your: from the greek word <u>sou</u> (su) which means: '<u>you</u>' or '<u>your</u>' - the second person singular personal pronoun. In context – referring to Jesus the Son of God.

Throne: from the greek word <u>thronos</u> which means: a throne, a (king's) throne or seat; by implication: kingly power, rule, or dominion; the 'seat' of government and rule. as in a kingdom.

O God: from the greek words <u>he</u> and <u>Theos</u> which means: the God or O God, the Supreme Being who created all things, and owns all things, and sustains all things. In context <u>refers to Jesus</u> the Son of the Father.

(is): from the greek word eis which means: to, or into; of place, time, or purpose.

Forever and Ever: from the greek words <u>aiona tou aionas</u> which means: <u>age of-the age</u>, or <u>forever and ever</u>; or ages stretching to infinity; thus forever and ever. (in context: equivalent to the Hebrew words used in Psalm 45:6 shown just below).

From prophetic word of Psalm 45:6 "Your Throne, O God, is forever and ever: the scepter of Your kingdom is an upright scepter."

Forever: from the Hebrew word <u>owlam</u> (from <u>olam</u>) which means: <u>of a long duration</u>, antiquity, futurity; usually translated <u>forever</u> or <u>everlasting</u>; the vanishing point; generally, time out of mind (past or future), i.e. eternity.

and-Ever: from the Hebrew word <u>wae</u> (<u>ad</u>) which means: <u>perpetuity</u>; forever, eternally; provides a double 'forever' emphasis; thus forever <u>and-ever</u>!

Consider the Context:

"My heart is overflowing with a good matter; I speak of the things which I have made concerning the King: my tongue is the pen of a ready writer. You are fairer than the children of men; grace is poured into Your lips: therefore **God has blessed You forever**. Gird Your sword upon Your thigh, O Most Mighty, with Your glory and Your majesty. And in Your majesty ride victoriously for truth and meekness and righteousness; and Your right hand shall teach You awesome things. Your arrows are sharp in the heart of the King's enemies; and the people fall under You. **Your Throne, O God, is forever and ever**: the scepter of Your Kingdom is an upright scepter You love righteousness, and hate wickedness; therefore God, Your God (the Father), has anointed You with the oil of gladness above Your fellows.' (Psalm 45:1-7)

Consider also the following prophecies concerning the Throne of Christ's Rule, and Kingdom:

"And in the days of these kings the God of Heaven shall set up **a Kingdom**, **which shall never be destroyed**. And **this Kingdom** shall not be left to other people, but **it** shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms; but **it** shall stand forever." (Daniel 2:44)

The Throne of Jesus is Forever and Ever

"I saw in the night visions, and, behold, <u>one</u> like the <u>Son of Man</u> came <u>with the clouds</u> of heaven, and He came to the Ancient of Days (the Father), and they brought Him (Jesus the Son of Man) near before Him (the Father). <u>And there was given Him (Jesus)</u> <u>dominion, and glory, and a Kingdom</u>, so that all people, nations, and languages, should serve Him (Jesus). <u>His dominion is an everlasting dominion</u>, <u>which shall not pass away</u>, and His Kingdom is one which shall not be destroyed ... But <u>the saints of the Most High</u> (true believers) shall receive the Kingdom, and possess the Kingdom <u>forever</u>, <u>even forever and ever</u>. ." (Daniel 7:13-14- 18)

Consider this portion of Daniels prophecy: "..., <u>and, behold, One like the **Son of Man** came with</u> the clouds of heaven, and came **to** the Ancient of Days, and they brought **Him** near before **Him**."

Here Jesus is not coming to earth, as foretold in Matthew 24:30-31, concerning His second coming; but rather, Jesus **the Son of Man** is coming with (or up within) the clouds of heaven **to** the <u>Ancient of Days</u>, unto God the <u>Father Himself!</u> I believe the actual timing of this event refers to the Ascension of Christ Jesus into heaven after His resurrection from the dead. Consider this passage:

"Therefore, when they had come together, they asked of Him, saying, 'Lord, will You at this time restore again the Kingdom to Israel?' And He said unto them, 'It is not for you to know the times or the seasons, which the Father has determined by His own authority. But you shall receive power, after the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.' And when He had spoken these things, while they watched, **He was taken up**; and a cloud received Him out of their sight. And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, who also said, 'You men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, shall come in like manner as you have seen Him go into heaven." (Acts 1:6-11)

Jesus has fulfilled the purpose of His First Coming by "saving His people from their sins'" He has Risen from the dead; and has ascended into heaven where He sits at the Right Hand of the Father. The Father has given His Beloved Son Jesus "Dominion and Glory, and a Kingdom, so that all people, nations, and languages, should serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom is one which shall not be destroyed." Later. at a time and day determined and known only by the Father, Jesus, the Son of Man, will come again in the clouds to firmly establish His reign forever and ever. Amen! Concerning this reign consider the following prophecies:

"For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the Government shall be upon His shoulder: and His name shall be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of His Government and peace there shall be no end, upon the Throne of David, and upon his Kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment, and with justice from henceforth even Forever. The zeal of the LORD (the Father) of Hosts (angels) will perform this." (Isaiah 9:6-7)

"And the angel came unto her (Mary), and said, 'Hail, you who is highly favored, the Lord is with you: blessed are you among women.' And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and pondered in her mind what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said unto her, 'Fear not, Mary; for you have found favor with God. And, behold, you shall conceive in your womb, and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God shall give unto Him the Throne of His father David; And He shall reign over the house of Jacob forever; and of His Kingdom there shall be no end." (Luke 1:28-33)

The Throne of Jesus is Forever and Ever

Consider again this statement in Psalm 45, "Gird Your sword upon Your thigh, ... <u>Your</u> <u>arrows are sharp in the heart of the King's enemies, and the people fall under You</u>.." And now consider the context of these verses:" (Psalm 45:3, 5)

"And the seventh angel sounded; and there were great voices in heaven, saying, 'The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ; **and He shall reign forever and eve**r.' " (Revelation 11:15)

"And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and He (Jesus) who sat upon him was called **Faithful and True**, and in righteousness He does judge and make war. His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns; and He had a name written, that no man knew, but He Himself. And He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood: and <u>His name is called **The Word of God**</u>. And the armies which were in heaven followed Him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean. And out of His mouth goes **a sharp sword**, that with it He should smite the nations; **and He shall rule them with a rod of iron**: and He treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS!" (Revelation 19:11-16)

Finally consider these words of encouragement:

Jesus said, "When the Son of Man (Jesus Himself) shall come in His glory, and all the holy angels with Him, then He shall sit upon the Throne of His Glory; and before Him shall be gathered all the nations; and He shall separate them one from another, just as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats. And He shall set the sheep on His right hand, but the goats on the left. Then the King shall say unto them on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world.' " (Matthew 25:31-34)

"And he showed me a pure river of Water of Life, clear as crystal, <u>proceeding out of the Throne of God and of the Lamb</u>. In the midst of the street, and on either side of the river, there was the Tree of Life, which bore twelve kinds of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. And there shall be no more curse; but the <u>Throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it</u>; and His servants shall serve Him:" (Revelation 22:1-3)

Give "thanks unto the Father, who has qualified <u>us</u> to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in Light; and He has delivered us from the power of darkness, <u>and has</u> <u>translated us into the Kingdom of His Dear Son</u>; In whom we have redemption through <u>His blood</u>, even the forgiveness of sins!" (Colossians 1:12-14)

The Throne of Jesus is Forever and Ever

Even forever and ever throughout all eternity Jesus Reigns – Always and Always!!!

His dominion is an everlasting dominion which shall not ever end!!!

His Throne and Rule shall stand forever!!!

All Glory, and Power, and Dominion, is Yours King Jesus!

The increase of Your Government and Kingdom and Peace shall be never end!
