

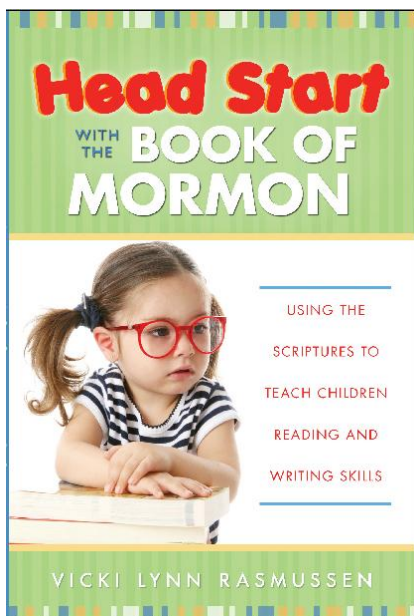
# 6 CORE STEPS TO READING THE BOOK OF MORMON

**A CHILD  
CAN:**

- develop a scripture reading habit
- grow closer to the things of God
- learn how to read and write

**Needed: one child; a \$2 B of M; a red pencil; 3x5 cards**

- 1- One at a time, present a card for each of the letters of the alphabet, numbers, and fifty basic words from the B of M.
- 2- A child can look for one of the above daily in their Book of Mormon, underline 5 of them, and recite its name each time.
- 3- After the above cards are learned, a child can read 2 verses with you daily (only the words they know; you read the rest).
- 4- A child can try reading one new word daily, and add another verse when two verses can be read easily.
- 5- After a child can read most all the words in one scripture column, they can read one page silently, underlining hard words.
- 6- Slowly increase their reading up to one chapter, or 20 minutes!
