Signals from the Commodore

If two (2) weeks earlier would help you, please let Terry know. If you go other places because mechanics are available to help you, we have Harry Nowak available to help you with your mechanical needs and he will come right to your boat at the club to do it.

The September Clambake was not very well attended this year. This event has shrunk every year since it started. Next year we will be considering a different and less expensive event for the September event. Jack Bopp will be talking more about that in the future.

Please remember that cradle day is October 11th and haul-out is October 18th and 19th. The specific schedule and work assignments are included in this issue of the "Soundings."

Remember haul-out starts at 7:00 AM SHARP. Be there and have the boat ready. We all know what has to be done, so let's do it.




