The board is already making plans for the upcoming season. Our new Rear Commodore, Merril Gray has compiled an exhaustive list of projects for us. We will try to indicate who the crew chiefs are and what jobs we will be doing on any given workday. Remember that if you need to change your workday, you should contact Merril and if possible the crew chief to arrange the change.

As was discussed in the Annual meeting, the board has decided to adopt a policy for this year only to waive the initiation fee for new members if they plan to keep a boat in the harbor for two years. The committee has already met and is working on various ideas and estimates that will be presented at the June meeting. This is an early plug that the June meeting would be a good one to attend.

#### **Notes from the Engine Room....**

Hello, everyone;

As you have seen in the Commodore's letter, the new board has had its first meeting and we are in the process of organizing and scheduling for the coming season at the club.

Another function of that meeting was to transfer responsibilities from previous officers to the new. While there has been a change in responsibility I am glad to be able to report that there will be a continuation of strong support for the Rear Commodore that will carry forward from the previous administration. Specifically, past Rear Commodore Larry Fedick has agreed to continue as liaison with government agencies for the purpose of gathering the permits the club needs for such things as dredging, weed control and so on. Larry has also agreed to continue to carry forward into the new season on the dredging project that will take place this year. These are very important areas that Larry has a special expertise in and has developed key contacts that do not transfer easily and I am very happy to have Larry's support in these matters. Also, Dock Master Larry Helber is continuing on in that role this year, and Tony Belaskas returns for another season to keep the club's facilities in good order. I welcome their support.

I am also grateful for the number of club members who have already come forward to offer their assistance as we work through the operational needs of the club- of which there is a long list. We are putting the list in order of priority and will have more information for you on that after the next meeting. Generally, there are two areas of concentration- dock repair and security, and improving the appearance of the club. Sound docks and a safe environment not only serve our members but also are an attraction to potential new members. Keeping the club looking good, whether that means mowing the grass or repairing the siding that blew off the club house last fall, protects the club's investment and also helps attract new mem-

bers. There are other tasks at hand such as shoreline repair on the North Shore and breakwall improvement to reduce silting in the channel. Whether we move forward on these and other issues depends on opportunity and availability of funds. None of the issues we have are insurmountable.

Vice Commodore Reports



#### Turning a Negative into a Positive!


