Rear Commodore Reports

Notes from the Engine Room....

Hello, everyone, Spring is on its way!

Now that we have established the working calendar for the club and know what our work days are going to be, we can move ahead and do some planning for the actual work that needs to be done. There are going to be four work days this year, the addition of a fourth work day in the fall to accommodate hauling our floating docks after the haul-out and before snow flies. Right now, that is the only project that needs attending to on the fourth work day but the fall work day may also lend itself to some other type of activities as well.



The club calendar is contained in this issue of the Soundings so you can see the dates that have been selected for the three spring work days. Rather than assigning members to a work day based on their position in the alphabet, we are going to try a different approach this year. The various jobs that are similar in nature are being grouped into projects, and we will be asking for crew chiefs to lead the various teams on each project. Re-construction and repair of several docks in the harbor are at the top of the list. The projects will be published in the Soundings next month along with the crew chief's name so you will know who to get in touch with to get on the team for a particular project. Some members may have the tools and the desire to work on dock building or repair, others may prefer to work on repairs to the clubhouse and so on. This way, you get to pick the project you want to participate in. Anyone who does not select a project will be required to appear for work day three and help finish whatever work is left.

We have been working on the weed control project for this summer. Larry Fedick is in the process of getting the required notifications out to area residents to finish the permit process, and a contractor has been secured. Dredging permits are in place and dredging in the harbor is scheduled for this summer.

We are talking with Chip Stevens as a representative of the Cornwall Trust about making repairs to the north shore bank of the north fairway. Chip has asked for a proposal that would shore up the eroding bank. Following that, we are looking at the installation of a new docking system in front of the repaired bank that would let us make maximum use of the space, which is presently underutilized.

That's it for now. Watch for the project list in next month's *Soundings* and pick your favorite project.
