The Elizabeth Seton girls clinched their seventh consecutive WCAC title with a Herculean effort from the girls' most valuable athlete, Maryland signee Taylor Tucker.

After winning the 100 and 300 hurdles (14.93 and 44.19) and running the second leg of the victorious 4x200 relay (1:41.36), Tucker thought her meet may be over.

But McNamara closed Seton's lead to six points with a 4x100 relay victory (48.09) in the second-to-last event of the day, and the Roadrunners called on their star once more. She opened up a 5-meter advantage after the first lap, and Seton sailed to a 4x400 time of 3:54.27, finishing with 199 points to McNamara's 191.

On a chilly, drizzly day, Tucker made some adjustments before her hurdling events to be ready. She finished just ahead of the Mustangs' Danielle Wheatley (14.96 and 44.45) in both races.

"I tried to jog a lot more because of how cold it is and really work on snapping down my trail leg, and that helped me [those] last meters," Tucker said. "I really hope I get MVP. That would be like a cherry on top."

Her wish was granted.

BATTALION 2 AND ACCRA DISTRICT 4 LADIES' AUXILIARY HOLD 2013 MARIAN RALLY AT ST. MAURICE CATHOLIC CHURCH, LA

Battalion 2 of the Third District Commandery of the Knight of St John International and Accra District 4 Ladies Auxiliary on Saturday 17 May 2013 marked the Marian month of May with a Marian Rally. The Rally started from the Trade Fair 1st Junction through some principal streets of La to the St Maurice Catholic Church where they crowned the Blessed Virgin Mary with a solemn mass.

Fr John Newman Tetteh-fio, the parish priest of St Maurice Catholic Church in his sermon during the mass, delved into a deeper understanding of the words of the Blessed Virgin Mary which was the theme for the rally; **"I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me"**, Luke 1:38. He explained to members how this statement by Mary should reflect in their life and how they are expected to emulate Mother Mary.

He broke down his sermon into the following;

I am.....- this first two words, Father said called to mind when God called Moses to go back to Egypt to free the Israelites. When Moses asked God who to say sent him when he asked, God answered, him to say "I AM" has sent you. Fr. Newman thus noted that I AM is the name of Yahweh. God was by virtue himself and did not depend on anybody. He then said this thus meant that whenever we say I am we were associating ourselves to God who is the only and original I AM.

Father continued that Mary from the beginning was a unique creature of God, thus when she said "I am" she was showing her uniqueness. This meant that when we also say "I am....." we are saying we are unique as God and our uniqueness is dependent on God. He explained that we lived not because we owed it to ourselves but because God had granted us that uniqueness to life. God had granted us the uniqueness to do what we wanted but that should be dependent on His will.

The Hand maid..... touching on **Maid**, Father Newman first explained who a **maid** was looking at our own setting, thus someone who helps in the house to do things. Thus Mary saying she was a maid meant that she owed her life to the service of God as a servant/maid. That her (Mary) life was just to serve God who is her master and she was the maid.

Hand..... Father said going back to creation story, God created everything by word of his mouth but when he got to man; he created with his own hands. Thus from the beginning man was a unique creature, made by the hand of God and having been made by the hand of God, we were to serve him.

Fr. Newman mentioned that in today's world, people want to be independent from God. They want to serve their own interest and claim their autonomy from God. This he hinted was unfortunate as humans were of God and it was by God's will that they lived.

Father said Mary had realized she was the hand maid of God by saying these words. Having realized that we are the hand maid of God, we should subject ourselves to the authority of God. We should ask God to use us and we should also use the autonomy God has given us over all creatures in the world to serve Him. We should always ask God for his ideas and plans for us so that we may follow them.

In his opening remarks, Fr. Newman congratulated the leadership of the Battalion and AGLA District 4 for choosing May as the month for the Marian Rally since May was the month of Mary per the Catholic calendar, he noted that this meant the leadership was in tune with the calendar of the church. He asked that members take whatever is done seriously as they are of great essence.

He said the procession in itself was a public demonstration of our faith, by which action we have caused many people to recall their faith in Christ Jesus. Those who might have forgotten or rejected their believe after seeing the procession could change and go back to God. He said it was also in a way an evangelism through which God blesses us abundantly.

After the celebration of the Eucharist, all members present were anointed.

This was followed by a recession from the church in a candle light procession to the Grotto where Mother Mary was crowned admits chanting of Marian hymns and prayers. Noble Sister Regina Nelson, a Past President of AGAL District 4 assisted Sister Lydia Kudalo, who acted as the Blessed Virgin Mary during the crowning.
