### Here's what's new at the Library

**Heartwood** – by Belva Plain: Septuagenarian Iris Stern questions her beliefs about what it means to be a woman and a wife when her daughter's marriage crumbles, an event that is complicated by the revelation of a dark family secret.

**Secrets to the Grave** – by Tami Hoag: Sheriff's detective Tony Mendez and child advocate Anne Leone investigate the murder of Melissa Fordham—a case that hinges on a key witness, Melissa's young daughter, Haley—and soon discover the shocking fact that Marissa Fordham never existed.

**Tick Tock** – by James Patterson & Michael Ledwidge: Detective Michael Bennett joins forces with FBI agent Emily Parker to root out a terrorist, who is threatening New York City with devastation of the greatest magnitude, and must simultaneously sort out his feelings for Emily and protect his ten adopted children.

**Unbroken** – by Laura Hillenbrand: Tells the gripping story of a U.S. airman who was the sole survivor when his bomber crashed into the sea during World War II and had to face thousands of miles of open ocean, leaping sharks, a foundering raft, thirst and starvation, enemy aircraft and, beyond, a trial even greater.

**The Widower's Tale** – by Julia Glass: Enjoying an active but lonely rural life, 70-year-old Percy haplessly allows a progressive preschool to move into his barn and transform his quiet home into a lively, youthful community that compels him to reexamine the choices he made in the decades after his wife's death.

**Call Me Irresistible** – by Susan Elizabeth Phillips: Ostracized for halting best friend Lucy's wedding, Meg finds herself stranded without family support in a hostile Texas town where she unexpectedly falls for Ted Beaudine. Romantic, funny and poignant.

**While We're Far Apart** – by Lynn Austin: In an unassuming apartment building in Brooklyn, New York, the lives of three people intersect as the reality of war invades every aspect of their world, and they find themselves growing and changing in ways they never expected – and ultimately discovering truths about God's love.
