

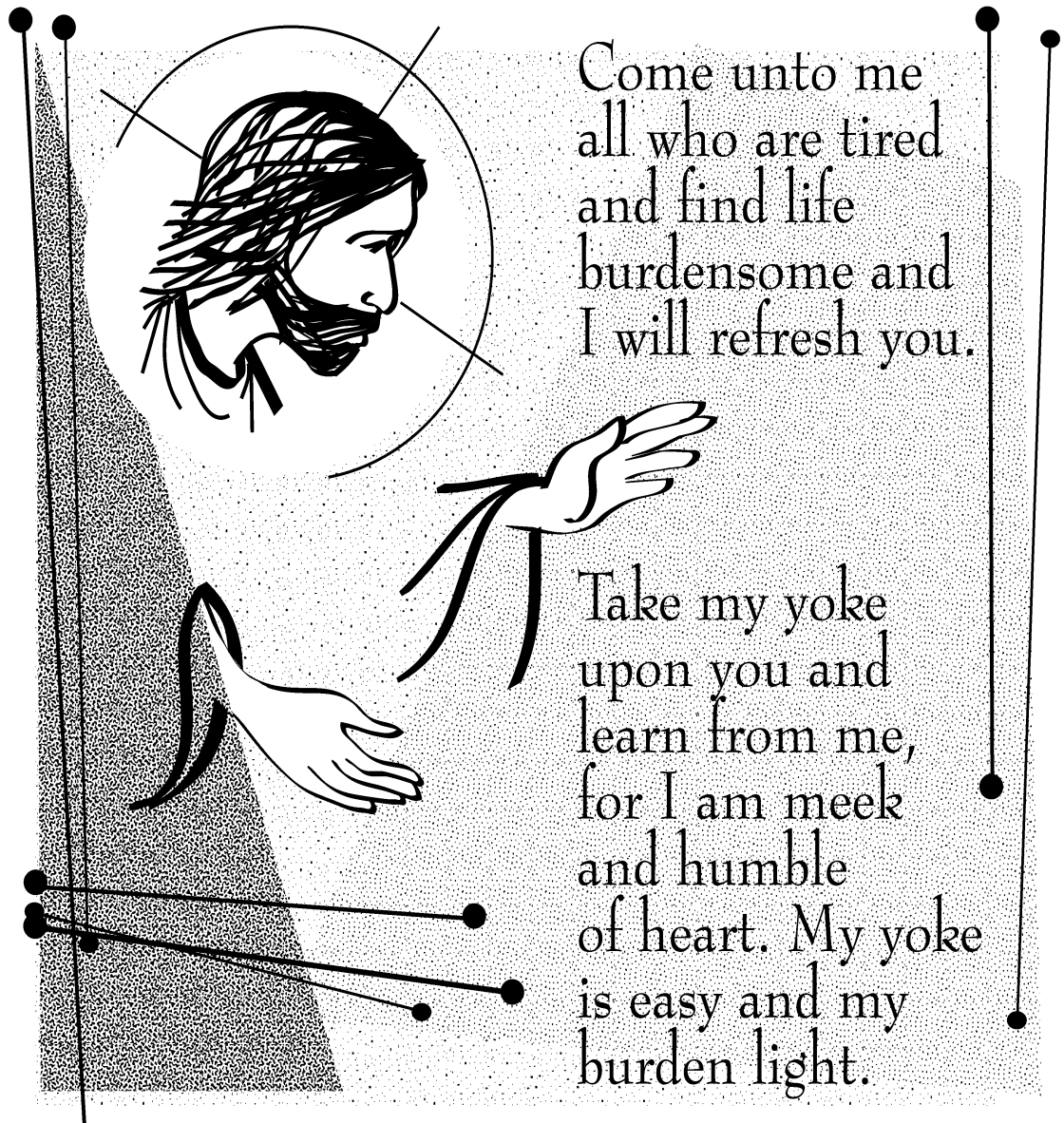
Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Children...

On the morning of June 14th public radio commentator Kerri Miller was interviewing author Lori Gottlieb who recently wrote an article which appeared in the June/July issue of Atlantic monthly titled *How to Land Your Kid in Therapy*. Gottlieb explains the results of her research in child psychology in that article. What she has to say about the way in which many are raising their children today needs to be heard.

Gottlieb is bold enough to say in an educated and intelligent way that children who have parents who strive to have their kids involved in *everything* and who are overly protective, constantly praise and seldom discipline their children, eventually raise children who will be very unhappy as adults, seek therapy and are less productive in the workforce than their counterparts who are raised by parents who teach their children the value of sacrifice, lessons from failing and the reality of defeat and disappointment. Gottlieb says that some of the parents of the last thirty years who have "adored" their children and were "best friends" with their children have raised adults who are now unhappy and unsatisfied with their lives.

The days when psychotherapists tended the wounds of an adult who grew up in a family with a distant and emotionally detached father and an overbearing mother are quickly being replaced by new patients who do not understand why their boss is not praising and promoting them for something as mundane as a well written email or for showing up on time for work every day that week. One conclusion that might be drawn from this study, as Gottlieb suggests, is that giving your kids everything, praising them for ordinary things which they should be expected to do anyway and shielding them from the consequences of their misdeeds, does not make them happy; it makes them sad.

Why is this a worthy topic for the parish bulletin? Friends, sacrifice and self-giving are the marks of true and responsible Christian love. We can all agree that love makes people happy. Happy people make other people happy. Our faith is about love which always involves a sacrifice. If we do not raise our children to sacrifice and be responsible for their actions, our parish communities will suffer.
