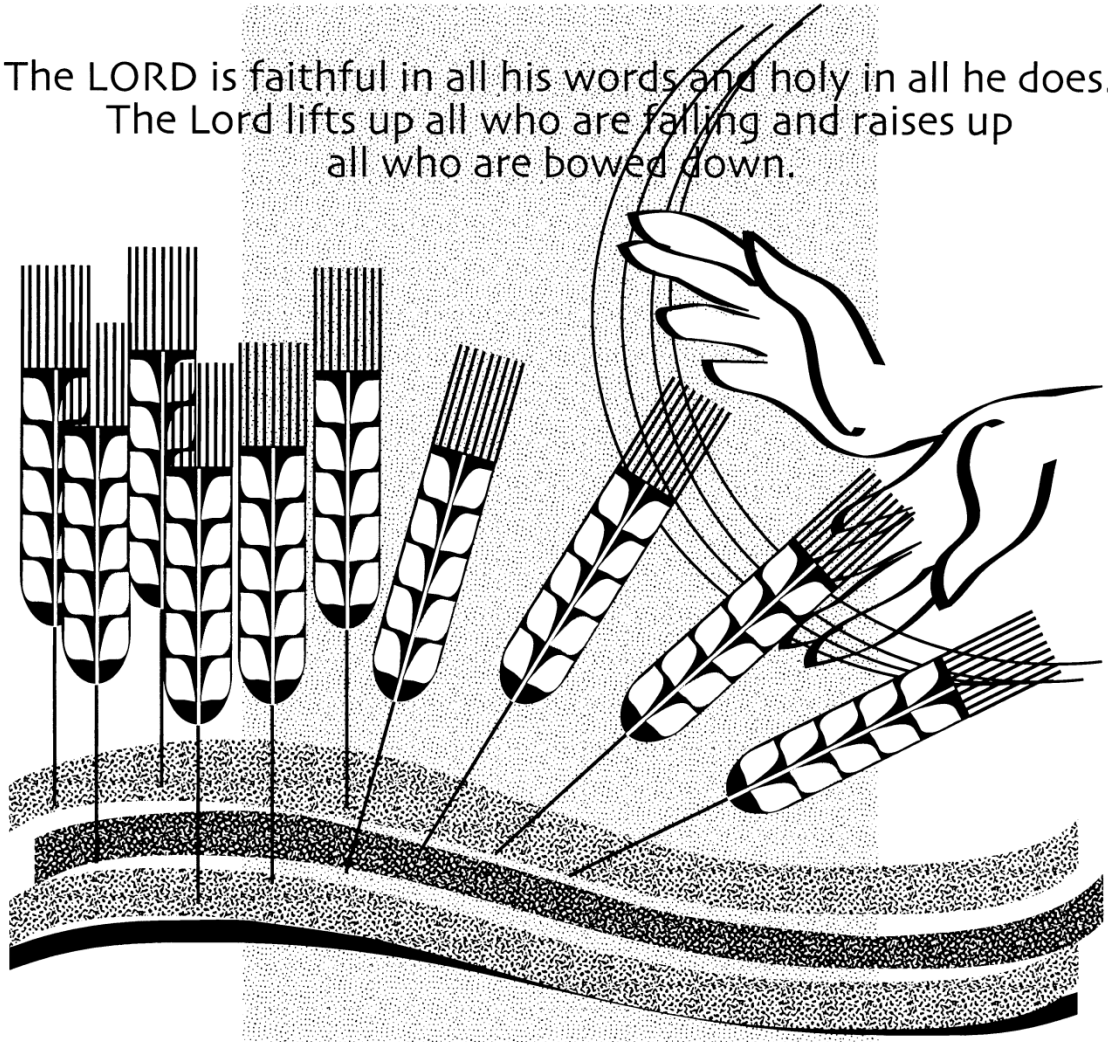
BAPTISM

Daylight Savings Time ends next Sunday, November 7th. Remember to set your clocks back one hour!

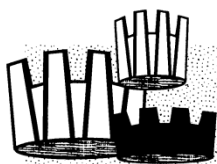

Going Out On A Limb!

The end of the Church's liturgical year is fast approaching. November is traditionally the month of celebrating the communion of saints and remembering those who have gone before us. It is also a time for us to reflect on our own death and future judgment: *What must I do to inherit eternal life?* In today's gospel Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector and major sinner, is looking for Jesus. Persistent and determined, he literally *goes out on a limb* by climbing a tree to get a better look. And then to everyone's amazement, Jesus invites himself into this stranger's home. As they meet, Zacchaeus' life is radically changed. Jesus does not judge as we might expect but extends warmth, forgiveness and love to this sinner. In turn, Zacchaeus straightens up his life, generously repaying and sharing his wealth with the poor.

All of us have been given many opportunities to encounter Jesus and to turn our lives around. He is always waiting and searching for us. Like Zacchaeus, Christ wants to be where we are, to be with us in our homes and to change our hearts and lives. God's love and forgiveness is pure gift – never a reward! May we respond to God's invitation to follow Christ's way of love and forgiveness. May we never hesitate to *go out on a limb for Christ!*

From Your Pastor,

I want to center on the DVD's on marriage which you received from our bishop. Some of you have watched it, but many have not.

The Church wants to uphold marriage as a "covenant by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership [for their entire] life. [Marriage] is ordered by its nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring. [It] has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament between the baptized." The Church comes to this understanding through theological reflection. The Sacred Teaching of the Church is born from God's revelation to her through Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition and the natural order of things (i.e. natural law). One simple definition of theology is: "faith seeking understanding." Drawing that out a little more, the definition of theology begins to look something like: "the search for the truth by using the supernatural power and light of divine faith with the natural power of the human mind." Now, the truth of a thing is revealed by the thing itself, and is found true by the process of reason. Upon reflection of what marriage is, the Church has found it to be a covenant between a man and a woman for the good of each other and the procreation and education of children. A valid marriage is also sacramental if the man and woman are baptized.

Please find time to watch the DVD. Seek and discover the truth for yourself!
