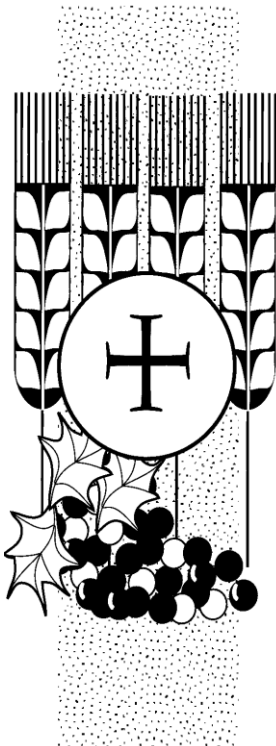

Body & Blood of Christ...

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. This feast originated in 1208, when Juliana of Retinnes, an Augustinian nun from Belgium, saw a vision of a lunar disk surrounded by rays of dazzling white light. One side of the disk appeared dark and in her vision she heard God tell her the darkness represented no feast on the Church calendar to honor the Blessed Sacrament. Thirty-five years later, Pope Urban IV, established the feast of Corpus Christi.

The feast began at a time when people never shared the Blood of Christ at communion and rarely shared the Body of Christ because of penitential practices. The main focus for the lay faithful was on the adoration of the real presence of Christ in the reserved Eucharistic host. In 1969, with the reform of the Church calendar, this early feast was combined with the feast of the Blood of Christ. This change is significant because today's feast emphasizes both our celebration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist, as well as devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

Today's feast is a reaffirmation of our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Today is also a time for reaffirming our belief in the fact that we are that Body as well. We are celebrating the mystery of the Lord's presence in our lives through the Eucharist. We remember Christ's sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins and the way to eternal life. We celebrate the divine gift that unites God with us in a bond of love and life.

We are the *People of God*: the people of the new covenant. As we bow and receive the Body and Blood of Christ, may our response be an enthusiastic *Amen* – an *Amen* that is lived everyday in a promise to love God, serve our neighbor and to carry out Christ's mission to the world. When we share the Eucharist, we are strengthened to do all that and more! When we come forward and receive Christ, we become his body, his hands, his feet and his voice for the world. As a favorite professor stated and which I like to pass on: *The Eucharist is not only a gift given to us by God. It is a gift we must give to one another.* Saying *Amen* and really meaning it are not always the same. Today we gather, as a community, with all of our differences, to celebrate our unity – our oneness in the Lord. As we continue to celebrate Christ's presence in our world, may our *Amen* bring about a world of peace, love and justice!
