Respect Life - On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court, in the Roe vs. Wade decision, made its worst mistake in history. The website of the Alan Guttmacher Institute (the research arm of Planned Parenthood, which is the single largest source of abortions in America), states, "From 1973 through 2002, more than 42 million legal abortions occurred." It also points out that "24% of all pregnancies (excluding miscarriages) end in abortion," and that abortions after 21 weeks of pregnancy number somewhere around 18,000 per year in America. In 2002, there were 1.29 million abortions in our country. Indeed, as we mark another Roe vs. Wade commemoration, it is time for all of us to get involved in the efforts to end abortion. #### Why We Give...

This Sunday we celebrate Epiphany. This celebration is to commemorate the event of the three Magi from the east who came to pay homage and give gifts to the Christ Child. The majority of the Catholic world exchanges gifts on Epiphany. When you think about it, it makes more sense to give gifts on Epiphany; the day gifts were brought to Christ on the "first Christmas". Since the act of giving gifts at Christmas has its roots in the Magi's gifts for Christ it seems that our gift giving should be directed toward him rather than each other.

We should hope that when we give we are even helping others toward salvation by our assistance to them. We feel good about ourselves when we do something good for others. There is nothing wrong with enjoying the sense of fulfillment when we do something for another. But if the act of giving goes no further than you and me then the act itself is deprived of reaching its fullest and most noble height.

When I give it must always be for the sake of the other so that God may be glorified in the end. I should be more happy that the other person is helped by my kindness than that I flourish and become happy by my kindheartedness on behalf of the other. I should never give so as to achieve my own ends. I should be more concerned that in my giving God is exalted and praised than that I be blessed by Him and happy in Him. The act of giving to an-other benefits me only if the will to be benefited is secondary to the will to give to the other. The gift must be sincere. My giving must flow from a pure desire to benefit the other rather than to benefit me. Giving sincerely to an-other is of the same kind of generosity of God who loves us for our own sake. It follows then, that I can only be truly happy if I know how to adore God and praise Him all for his own sake. God is "other" to us. If I do not know Him as one who is worthy of adoration, then my union with Him will not bring me the blessedness of which it is capable.

The three Magi did not show homage to Christ for their sake, but to glorify God. You can glorify God too. I suggest starting with your own family; your spouse, your children and your parents. Welcome them into your life. Love them with the love of God not for yourself, but for them and for the greater glory of God.
