
Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord December 25, 2011

The Christmas Infant...

Christmas brings with it a great amount of joy, and it should since ultimately God wants us to be happy because he loves us. The lover always delights in the joy of His beloved. We experience happiness when we receive good gifts from people, and we are very happy when we see the joy in the eyes of somebody who has received a precious gift from us. Most of these gifts which we receive are from our family members on whom we depend for affection, support and protection. When we receive a gift from them, we receive them.

God the Son came into this world by means of natural birth as an infant to be a gift to the human family. This was no accident. God could have easily come into the world by any means. But God chose to become incarnate (made flesh) as an infant through the natural birth of a woman betrothed to a husband. What is especially remarkable about the incarnation is that not only did God come to us by natural birth; he did not skip any of the steps yet he added his own divine attribute. The Bible tells us that the Virgin Mary actually conceived the child in her womb, which is normal, but, just to add a Divine quality to the process, God allowed Mary to remain a virgin through the whole process; she was a virgin at conception, a virgin at delivery (no pain, blood or risk) and even remained a virgin throughout her life. God chose this extraordinary approach to such an ordinary means to emphasize the origin of true joy.

Christmas is a great season of immense joy. It should be. God wants it to be. It is joy filled because it is about the promise of new life and renewal. That is why God chose to come to us by way of becoming an infant to a human family. Christmas is joy filled because it is about love that keeps generating more love. And that is what marriage and family is about too. Babies have a way of generating a lot of love in their families. There is a purity and innocence about Christmas that stems from the virgin birth of Jesus. I think that is why we long to see snow at Christmas; we want to see everything pure and white. Christmas is about being together with loved ones; extraordinary people whom we are acquainted with through ordinary means; with God who becomes part of the human family; with people who care for us as we care for them. With them we experience love, renewal and even new life. No, it is not by accident that God comes to us as a Child. God teaches us by what he says and by what he does. He is telling us all that there is a pathway to innocence, purity, joy and salvation in the family.
