

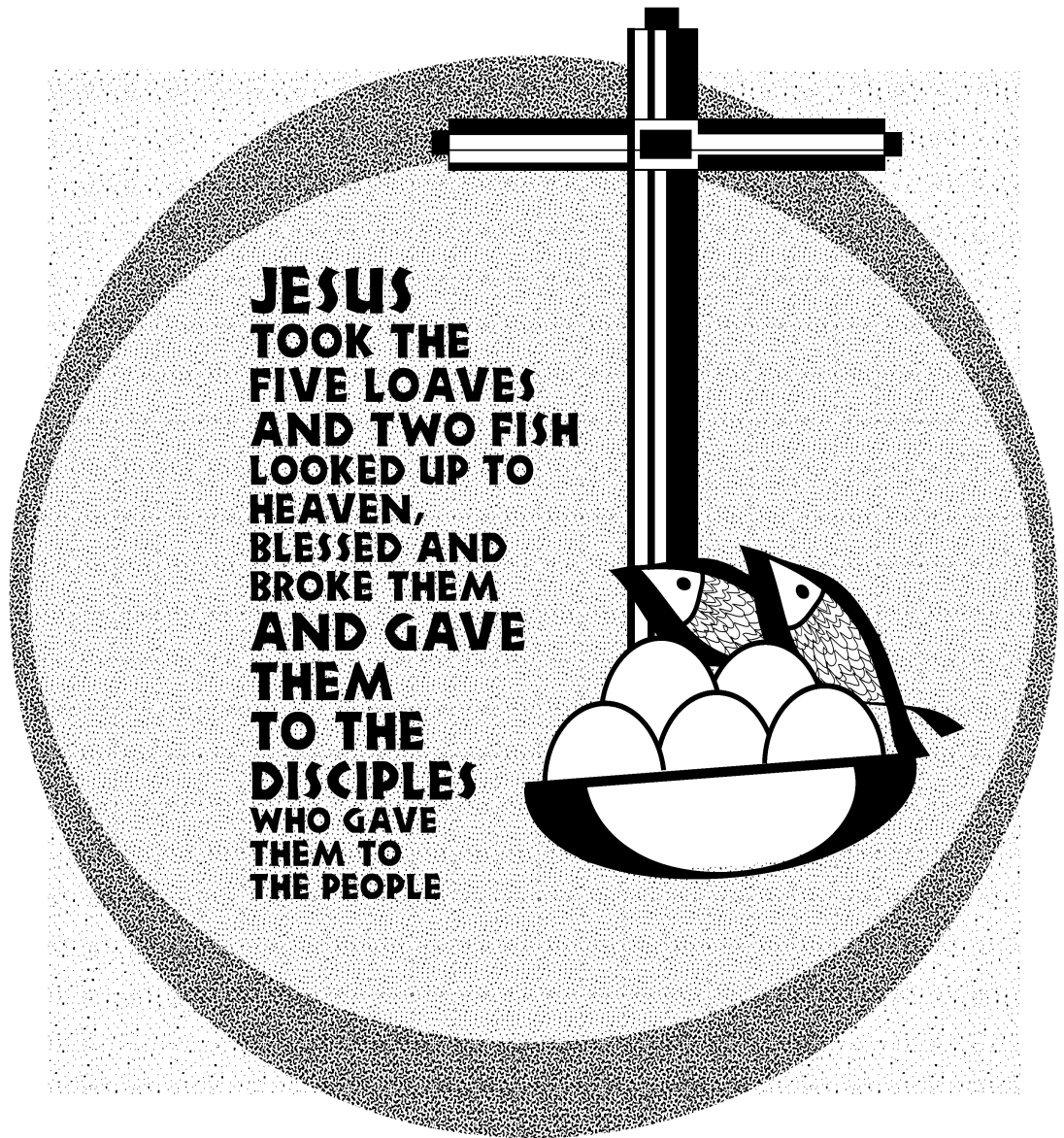
**Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Where Are We Going...

You have all heard by now that soon we will be using some new words at Mass. They will be closer to the official Latin text of the Novus Ordo Mass we have been celebrating since the time of the changes brought forth by the Second Vatican Council in the mid to late 1960s. The new words will communicate the deeper meaning of the original Latin. The Mass will not change, yet, we will experience change with the newer and more precise translation.

We are not going back. We are moving forward. We are not moving away from the changes brought forth by the Second Vatican Council. We are preparing to embrace in a more complete and profound way what The Council intended. This is true not only in the realm of Sacred Liturgy, but in many manifestations of what we believe as Catholics. We are preparing to receive the New Evangelization which Blessed John Paul the Great foretold during his remarkable papacy.

This phenomenon is quite universal. Last week I caught glimpses of the televised Mass for the dedication of the Altar at St. Joseph the Worker Cathedral in Sioux Falls. It was my first chance to see some of the changes in their Cathedral resulting from the extensive renovation. I like the changes. In that renovation I can see that the years of the dull, drab gray and sterile atmosphere which implied a hiding from our past – which some mistakenly thought The Council was about – are finally being replaced by a time in which we are embracing the truer sense of The Council; a greater continuity with the past, not a breaking away from any of our tradition.

Truth does not change. We must always strive for a deeper and more meaningful expression of truth. So when you begin to see parish churches being restored rather than remodeled – complete with communion rails and the tabernacle in the center; when you see religious brothers and sisters, monks and nuns wearing habits again – as many are – and when you hear children telling of what they learned from the Catechism of the Catholic Church in their religion class and see people returning to the sacrament of reconciliation in droves, you will know that you are witnessing not change, but a new and deeper expression of who we are and where we are going.
