
Fifth Sunday of Easter May 22, 2011

Former Bible Timeline Participants: If there is anyone who participated in the Jeff Cavins, 24 week Bible Study in 2008-2009 and you no longer use your notebooks with study questions, we invite you to donate your materials to be recycled and reused for the upcoming group. Notebooks may be dropped off at the parish offices or call Roxanne (472-8262). Did you know that Minnesota has the second-largest academic achievement gap in the nation? Right now, your action can help change this distressing fact. Currently, two important pieces of educational legislation are at stake at the Capitol. The first, an enrollment-options scholarship program, is a program for families of modest means. This legislation would aid students enrolled in persistently under-performing public schools in Minneapolis/St. Paul, Duluth and Rochester by providing them with a scholarship to attend a nonpublic school. The second piece of legislation is a tuition tax credit expansion program which would add nonpublic tuition as an eligible credit to the Minnesota K-12 Education Tax Credit and Subtraction program, aiding low- to moderate-income nonpublic school families across Minnesota.

The bishops' public policy arm, the Minnesota Catholic Conference, has been working on both of these measures which are designed to help close the nagging achievement gap in Minnesota. School choice options such as those mentioned above put the *power to choose* the education that is best for children where it *belongs—in the hand of parents*, who are the first educators of their children. The bishops' support of these measures is rooted in the principle, found in Catholic social teaching, that the family is the central social institution, and that parents are primarily responsible for equipping their children with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in life. Awareness Trip to Guatemala - Plans are finally underway and deposits are now being taken for this trip - January 10-18, 2012. We will be visiting the Mission of San Lucas Toliman on the shores of Lake Atitlan in the highlands of central Guatemala to learn more about the lives of the people there, sharing in the stories of their struggles and their joys. The trip is designed for adults, but youth are welcome with a parent. Preparations will include monthly meetings for the travelers to learn more about the history and modern day issues in Central America (beginning in June). The total cost of the trip will be \$1100-\$1200 per person and a \$100 deposit is required to hold a spot at this time.
