Light Shall Rise!

Today's readings challenge us to be a *light for the world* – to let our love, forgiveness and compassion shine so brightly that others will be drawn to God. We are to be examples of people who struggle to make a difference in today's world. As Christians, as people who deeply believe our Lord's "way of love" is the "way of life", there is no option. Although it is rarely easy, we are called to make the difficult choices between good or evil, principle over popularity, and/or personal comfort over community service.

Our world desperately needs light – the light of Christ's love. Instead of hiding our goodness, we are to follow Christ's footsteps with honesty, humility and grace. Our good deeds must shine brightly before us as examples of light and life. Let us embrace the Beatitudes as a road map so that when we act justly, darkness is scattered and *light shall rise!* May our Christian values overshadow the message of power and greed. By word and example, may we help *dispel the gloom of darkness and become dawning light* to a troubled world.

Our Gospel today is a continuation of the Sermon on the Mount. Last week, Jesus spoke of the Beatitudes – the values of God's Kingdom. Today, we are reminded that we are to embrace these teachings and transform the world. Transformation, change, takes time and is very hard work. Along the difficult journey of life, it is important to pause and be refreshed. In honor of the "Super Bowl" let me share a little humor. The following are *Football-Speaking Theology* definitions: **Bench Warmer:** An inactive church member. **Quarterback Sneak:** Liturgical ministers entering the church 5 minutes after mass begins. **Fumble:** A 15 minute homily. **Two-Minute Warning:** The altar server, taking a look at their watch in full view of the priest. **Illegal Motion:** Leaving before the closing song. **Blocking:** Standing inside the church door complaining to the pastor. **Extra Point:** What you receive when you tell the priest the homily was too short!

Life is too short so let us make the very, very best of our God given gifts. May we continue to have courage to be examples of light and life! As Charles Dickens wrote: *Have a heart that never hardens, and a temper that never tires, and a touch that never hurts.*
