

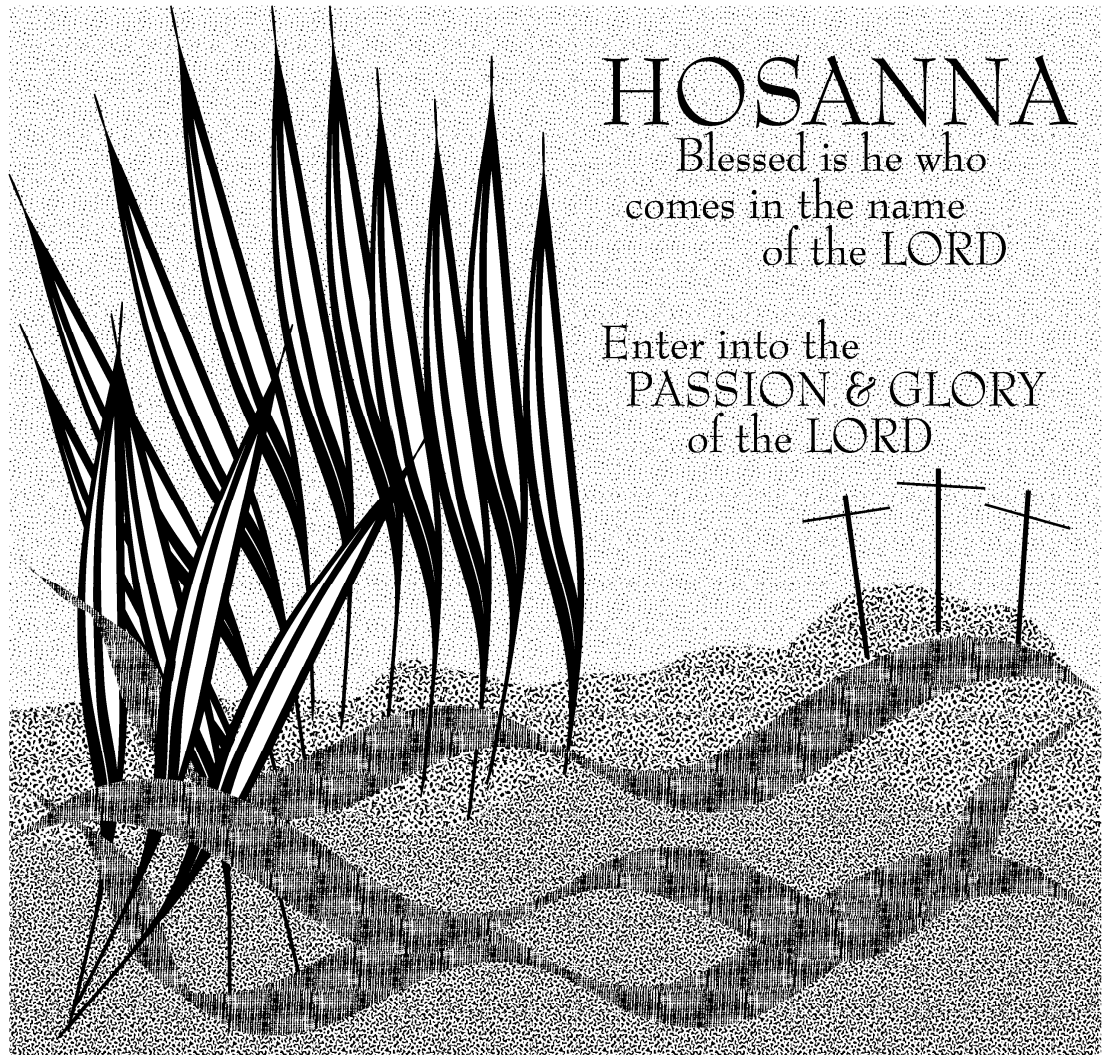
Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Experience The Journey!

Walking with Jesus, our Lenten journey is quickly coming to an end. Today, on Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion, we arrive in Jerusalem, our final destination, to begin the drama of faith – Holy Week –

a journey of celebration, suffering, death and resurrection. With waving palms, joyous music and triumphant “Hosannas” we listen to the familiar, powerful story and prepare our hearts for the weeklong, uphill road that leads to our salvation.

As we enter into the Triduum (the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil/Easter) I invite you to listen with renewed hearts to the familiar stories and events that will take place, the sacred words that will be proclaimed and the liturgical actions celebrated this week. Experience once again, a memorable banquet with your friends, including signs of loving service and hospitality. Prepare yourself for the bitter betrayal, loneliness, suffering, death and silence which soon follows. Then, when all seems lost, discover and experience the trumpeting sounds of praise and the unleashing of joyous *Alleluias!*

This week we need to forget ourselves long enough to remember God and the great gift of our salvation. Let’s clear our calendars and with grateful hearts schedule time to worship the Lord. Let’s also set aside all that keeps us from being God’s holy people: pride, fear, greed, anger, jealousy etc. We remember that God triumphs over sin and we are still a people of hope. Let’s recommit ourselves to walking with Christ – a journey that never stops but one that keeps us moving closer to God and new life.

During Holy Week we certainly experience a contrast of moods in our liturgy. The Paschal Triduum is the very heart of our liturgical year. The liturgy of the three days celebrates *the greatest mysteries of the redemption (PS, 38)*. The Triduum is, in a word, *sacramental*; for the Resurrection is not just remembered, as great events in history are remembered; the Resurrection *happens* (LTP: Sourcebook 2011). The Triduum is also **one** continuous liturgy and that is why we enter and leave in silence on Good Friday. In light of this fact, our Holy Week schedule changed somewhat last year. Whichever parish has the Easter Vigil Mass, will have a Holy Thursday and Good Friday celebration (the Triduum). In addition to that particular parish, a second Holy Thursday and Good Friday liturgy was scheduled, to help accommodate our unique 4-parish cluster. Trying to schedule liturgies is often very difficult but the Church does give us some guidelines. Not everyone has a scheduled liturgy but remember that everyone is always welcome in all of our parishes. I personally invite each of you to pick up your palms (and your heavy crosses) and to participate in the Paschal Triduum – not only remembering what the Lord did for us, but through the sacraments knowing that we actually experience it!
