

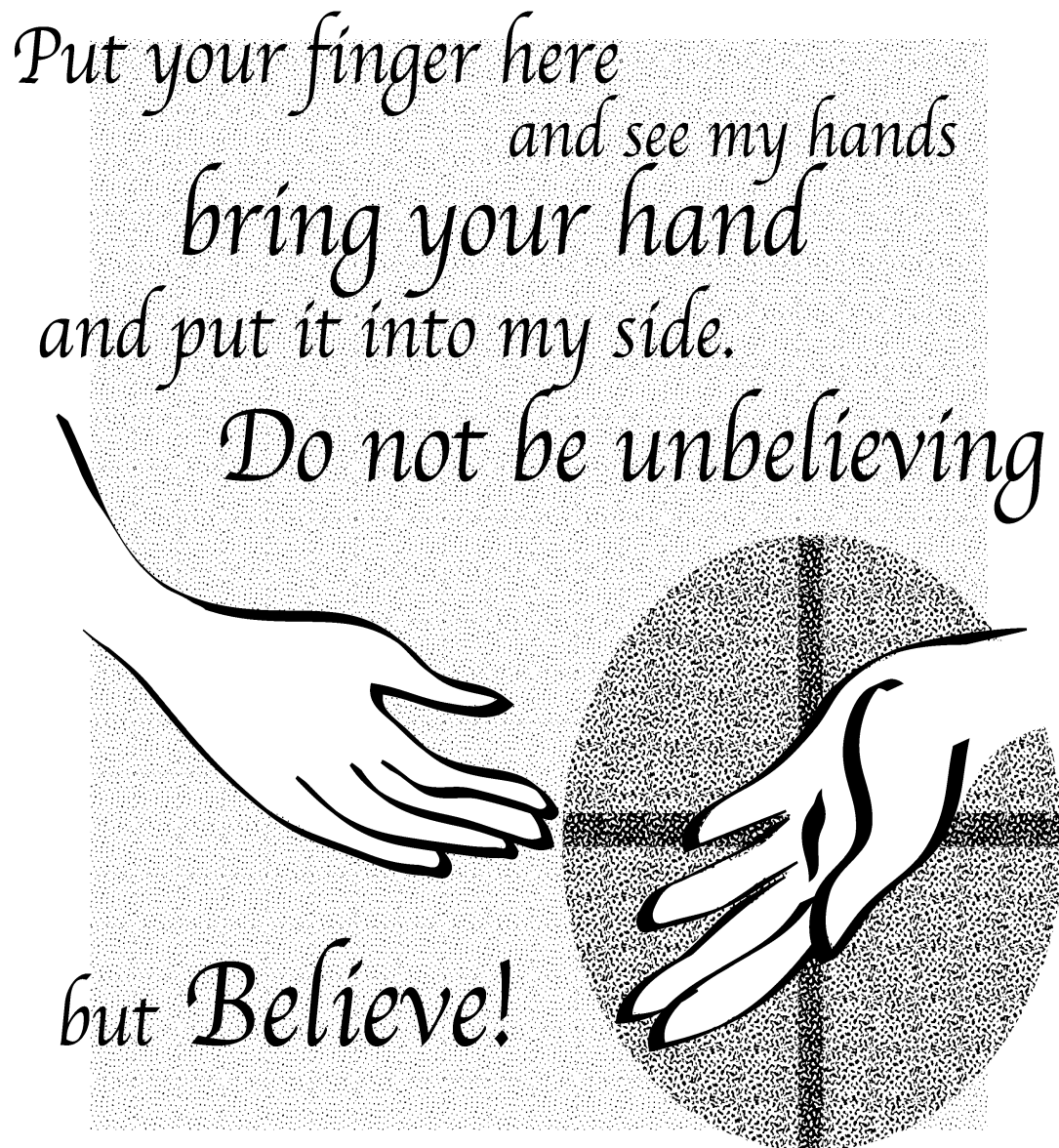
Second Sunday of Easter

**Beatification of Pope John Paul II:** This Sunday, the Church is celebrating the beatification of Pope John Paul II. *Beatification is an act of law and liturgy through which the Church acknowledges that a candidate for sainthood enjoys the glory of heaven... The process of John Paul II's beatification was conducted by the Diocese of Rome. During the investigation, more than a thousand witnesses were interviewed and many documents reviewed evaluating the life of John Paul II in light of the theological virtues (faith, hope, love) and the cardinal virtues (prudence, justice, fortitude, temperance). The next step of the process was the recognition of a miracle through John Paul II's intercession. After completing the procedure on a miracle, Pope Benedict set the date for the beatification as May 1<sup>st</sup>, Divine Mercy Sunday. The entire process for John Paul II lasted nearly six years. It was necessary to carefully examine his rich life, his childhood and youth, his theological studies, his work as a young priest and professor, and his time as archbishop of Krakow and pope.* (April 2011 **Columbia**.) John Paul II was an extremely popular pope and was highly respected with reverence and esteem. Many articles have been written about today's celebration, as well as this unique man. Let us remember and keep Pope John Paul II in our prayers on this very special day!

## ***Easter Peace!***

As we celebrate this second Sunday of Easter, we continue to examine the meaning of Christ's death and resurrection and what it means to follow the Risen One. In today's gospel, the Lord visits the disciples on the evening of His resurrection. In spite of everything that recently took place (betrayal, anguish, agonizing death) the first words from Jesus is – *peace*. What an incredible word! *Peace – peace be with you...* God hasn't given up on us. Instead, God sent Jesus to bring peace and reconciliation. Christ's resurrection means that it's never too late to start over: *All things are new through Christ*. Death is not the end – our losses can be redeemed; every day is a new beginning! We don't need to be afraid to live as Christians because *the peace* that Christ gives will help us cope with the fears and tensions of everyday life. The *peace* which Christ gives brings *new life* and puts an end to fear. Jesus is not found among the dead but the living.

Is your faith alive? As Christians, we cannot hide our love for God and for one another. The peace of the Risen Christ escorts us into a whole new world, where nothing will ever be the same again. The peace of Christ is life-changing because it calls us to true discipleship. The peace of Christ is extended to all – to EVERYONE. Recently I read, *Christ's peace is a costly gift that demands radical conversion. Christ's peace unites us with all sorts of people we would rather avoid* (April 2011, **America**). God sent Jesus to bring peace and reconciliation to a world filled with wars, oppression, rivalries, prejudices, "haves & have-nots", corruption and power struggles. Little has changed over the years but as Christians we are called to become Easter people – to carry on the mission of Christ – to live Easter peace. Inch by inch, day by day, choice by choice we work with Christ to transform the world. We cannot be a "doubting Thomas" but people who find peace through faith. We are called to believe the Easter miracle: The risen Lord is still with us! We are called to believe that in the end all will be well. As John Shea wrote, *The Resurrection teaches us not how to live – but how to live again, and again, and again.* May Christ's Easter greeting of peace bring you abundant joy and grace!
