

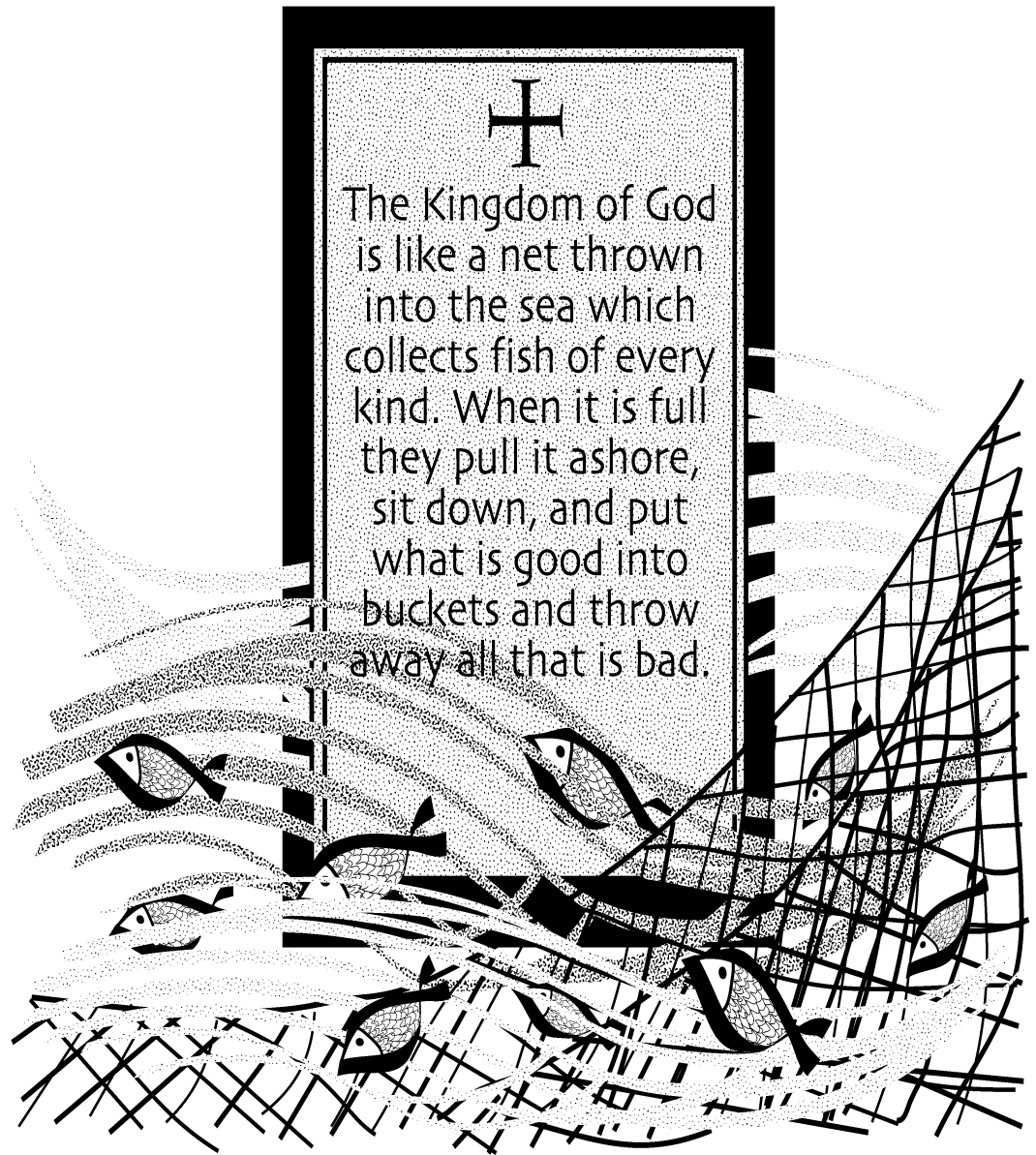
**Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time**

### *The Times They Are A-Changin'!*

Many of you have heard the saying that *change is the only real constant in our lives*. I happen to agree with that statement and have found that it is equally true concerning the Catholic Church over the past years. The Church never stands still (even though we do move slowly sometimes). While the core doctrines never change, how we live out the mysteries is a work-in-progress. We are a pilgrim people, a people on a journey seeking to build the Kingdom of God.

Almost 2000 years ago, at the Last Supper, when Jesus instituted the Eucharist, he spoke these words: *Do this in memory of me*. The Church continues to fulfill this command, each and every time we celebrate the Mass. Through our celebration, we participate in the fundamental mystery of our faith – the memorial of Christ's passion, death and resurrection.

The way Mass has been celebrated over the centuries has undergone various changes but the heart of the liturgy remains the same. It continues to be the celebration where Catholics come to hear the word of God in the Scriptures, and to receive the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. Perhaps you have heard that on the First Sunday of Advent (November 27, 2011) we will be hearing and saying different words as we experience the new translation of the third edition of the *Roman Missal*. This revision refers to the book

we previously called *The Sacramentary* (or as I tell the altar servers – Father's Red Book). The changes will be reflected in the words we speak and/or sing at Mass and in the prayers that the priest will recite.

Many of us have already been preparing for the changes. Our 4-parish musicians are beginning to practice the new responses. Our priests of the Winona Diocese, as well as other diocese, have attended numerous seminars and presentations. The diocese also offered several workshops for lay ecclesial ministers at various diocesan gatherings. Both clergy and laity were invited to national conferences, including the one that many of us attended at the University of St. John's these past two summers. The numerous opportunities were offered so that we – the Church – the People of God may create more vibrant worshipping communities.

Perhaps the greatest mistake, or missed opportunity, at the time of implementing the previous edition of the sacramentary (almost forty years ago) was the lack of catechesis or education. Having learned from the past, we are committed to doing a better job this time. With that in mind, I begin an introduction to the upcoming changes with this week's bulletin column. For the next several months, a portion of the bulletin will be used to discuss the new texts and answer frequently asked questions. In addition, we will have resources for our 4-parish cluster to take home and study. Remember 'pew cards'? We'll even have those available for us as we learn the new responses. We will direct you to web sites that our bishops have endorsed and recommended. Today's Missal, which we use each week at Mass, will provide helpful information. In other words, together we will prepare for the change that lies ahead.

Yet, we know that change can produce challenges. Some of us do not like change, especially the older we get. Some people resist change in any form – we bristle at the thought of having to do things differently. But as a person who began to study the new translation two years ago as an admitted skeptic, let me reassure you that the journey ahead will not be a difficult one. Fr. Paul Turner summarizes the change best: *New Words... Deeper Meaning, Same Mass*. We've lived through other changes and yes, the Church continues to live on. So let the Church respond: *Thanks Be To God!*
