

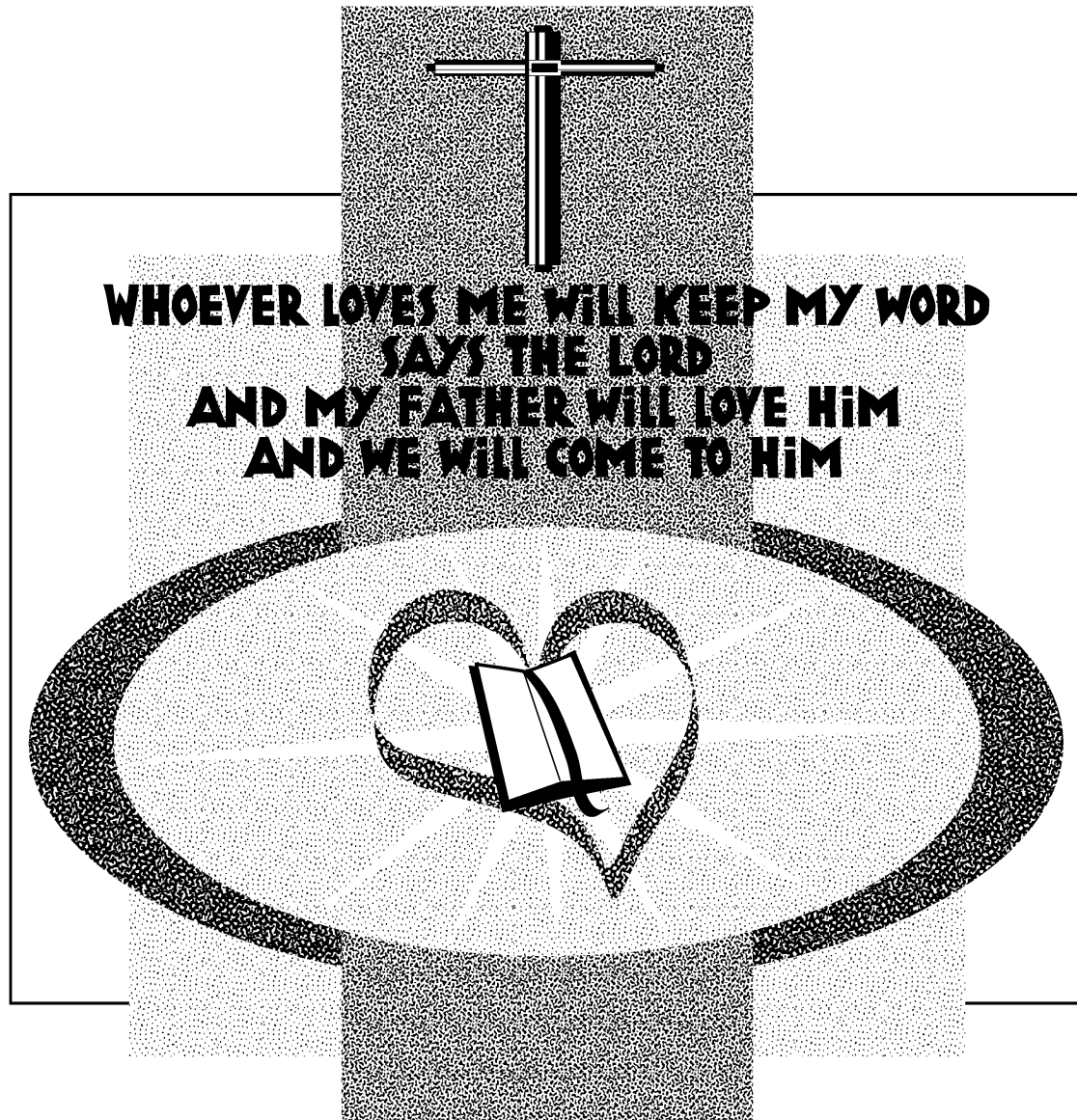
Sixth Sunday of Easter

Never, Ever Alone!

The Church continues to celebrate the great Easter event this weekend with another reminder that we are never alone. In today's gospel from John, we hear part of our Lord's "farewell discourse": *I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.* Jesus, after reassuring his disciples that they are loved, promises to send another Advocate. In Greek, "the Advocate" is the "paraclete" or the One who stands with us. The Advocate is the Holy Spirit – our helper, comforter, counselor, protector. The Holy Spirit picks up where Jesus left off.

In a real sense, Jesus promised his disciples that the relationship they had with him would continue, even after his death. Although in a different way, Jesus would always be with them through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Advocate is God's life-sustaining presence in and beside us and among us. The Holy Spirit strengthened the disciples – that same Holy Spirit gives us the courage to continue in difficult times. We can rejoice that we are an Easter People – filled with hope, filled with the Holy Spirit. We truly are never, ever alone! That same Holy Spirit lives within each and every believer and it is the Holy Spirit that calls us to be like Christ: compassionate, trusting and always responding with love, patience, forgiveness, justice and charity. I pray that each of us may continue to grow in our understanding of the Easter gift – the gift of new life, the gift of the Holy Spirit, the gift that keeps on giving!

Speaking of gifts – this weekend, we pause from our busy schedules to remember our gift of freedom. Monday is Memorial Day, a National Holiday that is set aside to publicly remember and honor those who sacrificed their lives for love of this nation. Through the courageous actions of many brave men and women this country continues to be a land that upholds the values of peace, freedom, and privilege. May we never take these gifts for granted and may we continue to remember past and present sacrifices. Remembering that we are never, ever alone, we also pray that the Holy Spirit will bring those who are soon to be deployed, and their loved ones, much comfort, strength and courage.
