Mass Schedule...

After much private prayer and discussion with the councils of the four parishes in our cluster, a decision has been made regarding the Mass schedule. I have looked at what we have had in place for the Mass schedule in the last three-and-a-half months and would like for it to stay in place up to end of June, when, after much discussion with the parish councils, we will take another look at the schedule so as to make any necessary adjustments. I do not see this as a "trial", but a beginning to finding a better arrangement for the mass times and an end to the rotation as we know it now. That is to say, while some adjustments may be made for the month of July onward, most of what is in place now will stay in place. I have been in dialogue with parish councils on this issue for over a year. I have listened to the parishes which had the biggest grievances toward my original proposition of one year ago. I hope this arrangement addresses some of their concerns. If mature and respectful dialogue takes place between all of us, we can continue to arrive at a system which comes closer to serving all parishes involved, within reason.

This arrangement is not designed to fit everyone’s personal preferences. It is designed to give stability to the life of our parishes. I know that within our parish communities there are very faithful and outstanding witnesses to the faith who will now find themselves torn between making insurmountable sacrifices to make it to their home parish for worship at an inconvenient time, and making arrangements to attend regularly at another parish which is not their own. It is these families toward which my deepest concern is directed at this time. The greatest risk now is that some the most faithful of the flock stand the chance of being sacrificed in an effort to reach the sheep which have lost their direction. I ask that we all be very attentive to the faithful families who find themselves in this situation; to reach out to them and give them special treatment in your parish communities. Bring them in and care for them. Make them know that your parish is their home.

We are still a four parish cluster. We can move forward in a spirit of calm stability. Consistency can help to refine the deep faith which already exists in our communities. If we let things settle in place, not only can we maintain our parishes now, we can set up a movement toward mission in our parishes which can help them all to flourish in the future.
