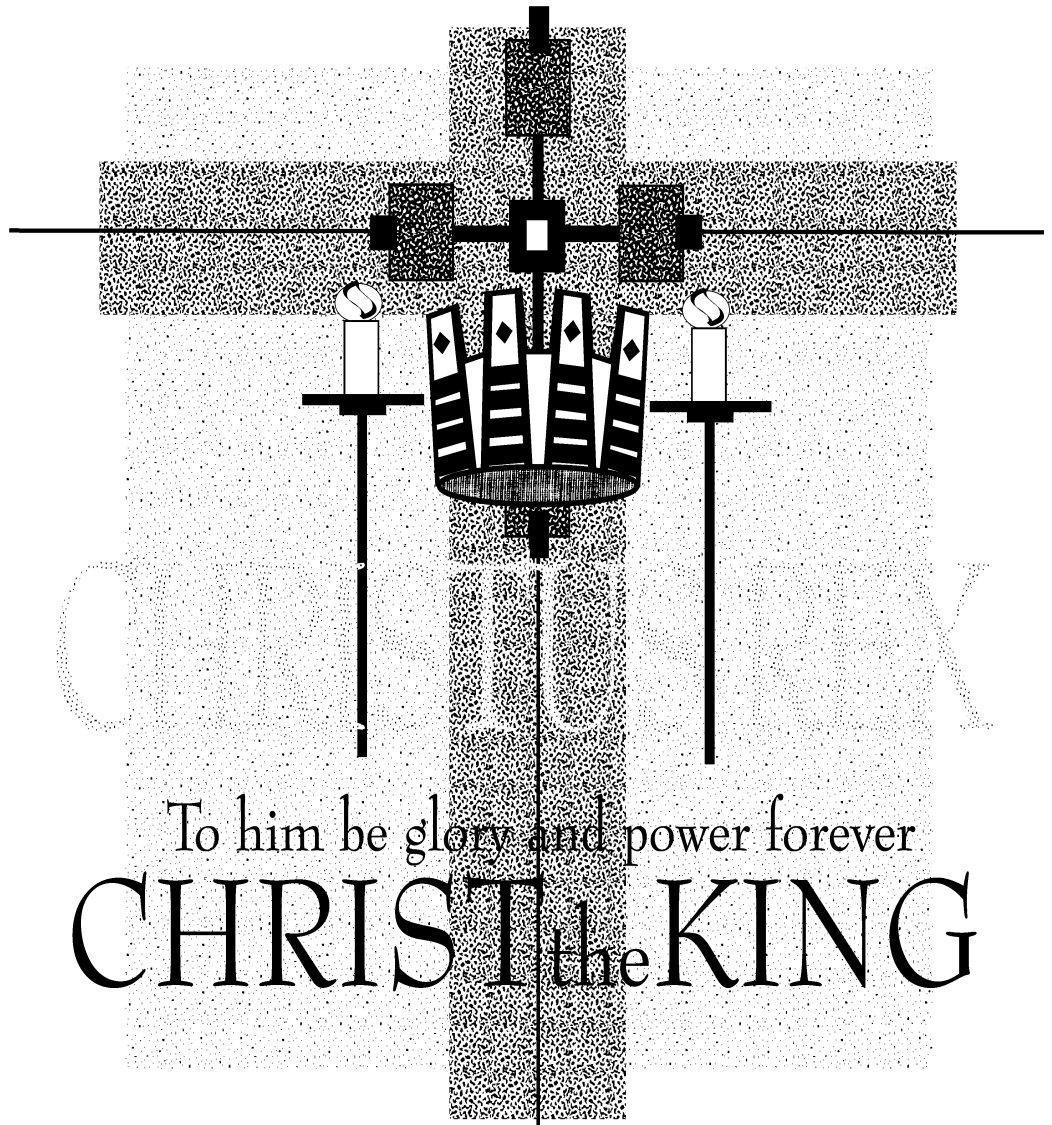

Pesky Little Changes...

Beginning on the first Sunday of Advent (November 27), we will be hearing new translations of Mass prayers we have heard and prayed for decades. This new translation will unite us closely to the Catholic world; the blessed result of an immense undertaking.

When Pope John XXIII convoked the 2nd Vatican Council, which began October 11th 1962 and ended on December 8th 1965 under Pope Paul VI, the liturgical movement was already decades old; that is to say, the changes many attribute to occurring after the council had already been taking place long before the council. The hope was that devout and active participation by the faithful be more easily achieved in the Mass.

What followed the council was an interim 1965 Missal (Mass book) that was a mixture of Latin and English, followed in 1970 by what was called the "First Typical Edition" of the Mass – essentially the Mass we use today. A minor revision occurred to that edition in 1974. In 1985 the "Second Typical Edition" arrived. These translations used a principle of "dynamic equivalence," meaning that the translators took the original Latin prayers and paraphrased them into English. This was meant to be an interim translation.

In the Jubilee year 2000 Pope John Paul II announced that a "Third Typical Edition" of the Roman Missal would be produced, with a new translation from the Latin using new principles outlined in a document called *Liturgiam Authenticum* (the authentic liturgy). This mandated a closer and more accurate translation from the Latin originals. With this, the old method of dynamic equivalence used as the rule to paraphrase the Latin to English was replaced by a method known as "formal equivalence" to render a more exact translation.

Why is it so important to adhere to the Latin originals? If every language continued to paraphrase, we would soon be celebrating different liturgies in different languages and much of the unity of the church would be lost. Then we lose the essence of what it means to be a Catholic Church – the word "catholic" means universal, you see. It makes sense then that every language to which the Mass is translated, adhere to as close a translation to the official Latin text as possible to ensure that the Mass itself remains the same no matter what language celebrates it.

When you think about it, this new translation draws us closer to our Catholic brothers and sisters throughout the world. In our own language, we will be saying the words they have been saying at Mass for decades. How great it is when we dwell in unity! (Psalm 133)
