
Third Sunday of Easter April 22, 2012

Spiritual Adoption Part I...

One day last fall, as the parish staff and I were preparing the bulletin and the Universal Prayers for Sunday Mass, we came across the following quote from the Priests For Life website. (We sometimes use that website for petitions.) Here is the quote from the Abortion Survivors program conducted by the organization: "A woman reported telling her nine year old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said, 'I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?" (Abortion Survivors, p.36).

I was taken aback when I first read this quote. I didn't believe it at first, but I don't know what it was that I didn't believe about it. Maybe it was that I didn't believe a child could have that kind of perception. I had never heard of a child knowing what happened in the womb to children who had been conceived before him. Yet, you hear about these kinds of strange psychological phenomena, like somebody receiving a heart transplant from somebody who has an interest in horses suddenly now has a new found interest in horses. Is it because of the new heart? It's not that I didn't believe abortion is evil before, it's just that this story seemed to bring it to a deeper level; a level that goes beyond the murder of an innocent child, if that isn't bad enough. Now abortion is known to affect the psychological wellbeing of subsequent children who are carried to term; "wanted" children, if you will.

I became convinced that the above story is true after watching the movie "October Baby" last Monday. The movie is a must see. The young woman who is the October baby in the movie suffers from trauma as an adult resulting from her being a victim of a failed attempt at abortion. The couple who rescued her when she was an infant never told her that she was adopted until it was made clear that she needed to seek counseling for the *emotional trauma she received while still in the womb*.

I started to do some research on pre-natal and perinatal psychology and found that there have been recent discoveries of children in the womb being affected by their parent's attitudes and activities. The research is very convincing, and it is based on the discovery that the unborn child is a *feeling, remembering, aware* being, and because he is, what happens to him - what happens to all of us - in the nine months between conception and birth molds and shapes personality, drives and ambitions in very important ways.

I am glad, now, that I was made aware of the fact that unborn babies are sensitive to parent's feelings about them. It gives us who want to stop abortion in all of its forms another tool to convince those on the fringe that a fetus is a person with a heartbeat, a body, a soul and that it has feelings and can decipher when he is safe and who he can trust. Children are wondrous gifts!

Once again I need to say how pleased I am with the Catholic Daughters of the Americas. The St. Bernard Court of Lismore has begun their Spiritual Adoption program now. I hope you all participate in praying for babies who are in danger of abortion. I think they know who is praying for them.
