

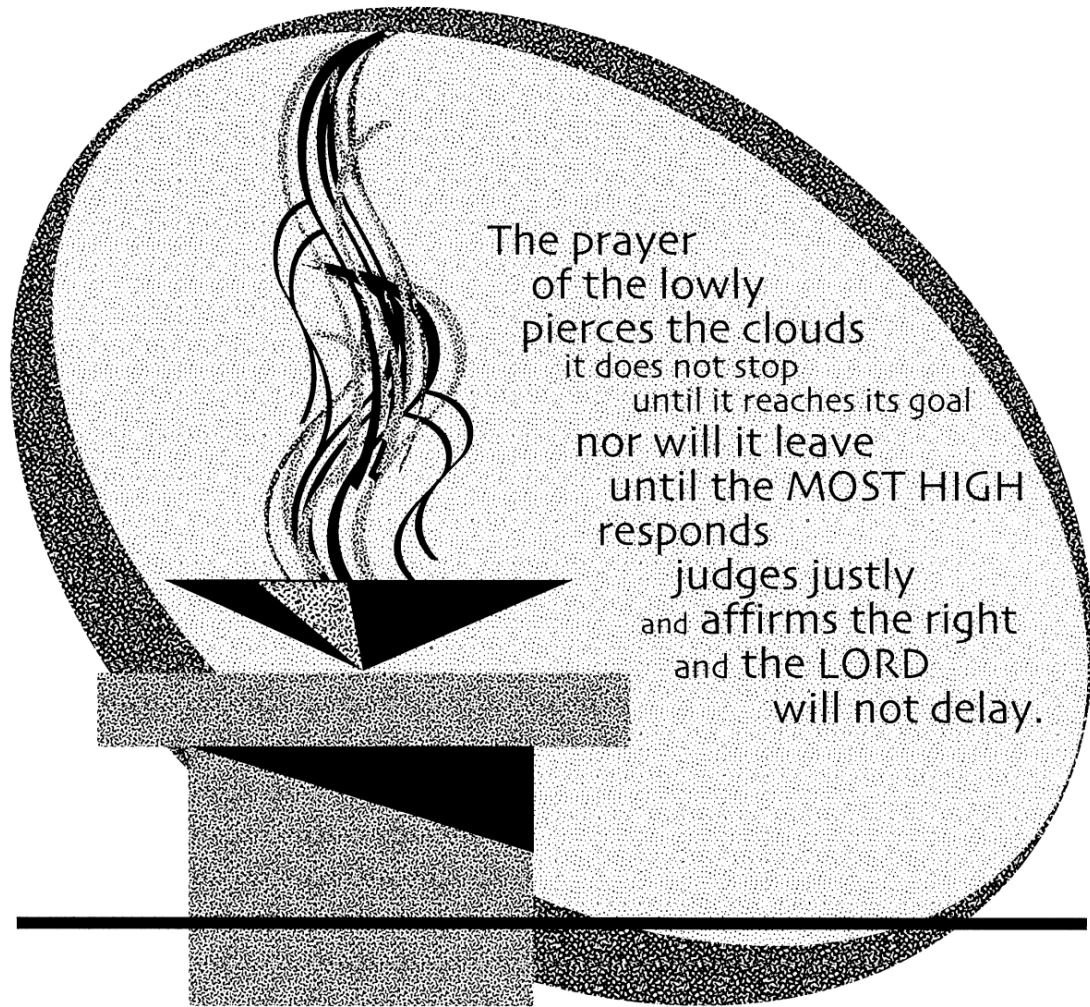
**Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Humble Prayer!

Today's gospel is a continuing lesson on prayer: *Whoever exalts himself will be humbled and the one who humbles himself will be exalted!* What kind of prayers do we offer God? Are we like the tax collector, filled with regret and hope as we pray, or are we more like the Pharisee, offering a list of our own achievements and criticizing others? Jesus teaches that there is no room for self-righteousness in our prayer life. We must not exaggerate our importance or consider ourselves superior to others.

Richard Foster once wrote: *Prayer is not a set of words or actions to be mastered, the way one would master auto mechanics or algebra. When we pray, we come with our whole mixture of tangled motives and twisted past. And so we are saved by grace, we live by grace, and we pray by grace. It is all we have. And it is all we need.* In other words, today's gospel was written for those who think they don't have a prayer in the world to make it to heaven. But, prayer is what they do have. Prayer is what all of us have. Genuine prayer recognizes our need for God; honest prayer recognizes that we are sinners. Sincere prayer recognizes that we need God's mercy to be saved; humble prayer recognizes that we are in the presence of a loving God who invites us to have heart-to-heart conversations. Like Paul, in today's Second Reading, may we *keep the faith and finish the race* through humble and constant prayer!

From the Pastor...

First, I need to once again address the issue of communion being brought back to the pews for those who lack mobility. The communion rite has always involved a procession to the front. Unfortunately, life changes and as we age we may not be able to walk the same distance during the procession that we have been walking our whole life. If this is the case for you I ask that you be seated near the front or other designated areas, depending on the parish, so that those who are distributing communion will be able to step close to you without having to walk a great distance. This is not an easy topic to address. I know that life's changes take their toll on each one of us. We all are asked to give up what we were once familiar with, sometimes that means giving up our favorite pew at Mass and sitting closer to the front. Maybe the rest of us can ease the burden of our less mobile brothers and sisters and sit closer to the front so that they do not feel like they stand out so much.

Secondly, it was a joy to celebrate Mass with the nearly two-hundred junior high students who came to St. Adrian for the youth rally. They came from the other eighteen parishes throughout the Worthington Deanery and twelve were from our four parishes! Part of the day included a Mass, of course, and it was energizing. They participated well, both at Mass and the rally which was led by Fr. Tim Biren at the Adrian elementary school. I hope that more will join us for future events and I strongly encourage any senior high students to consider going to the Diocesan Catholic Youth Conference on the weekend of November 13th & 14th.
