
Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time November 14, 2010

Promise of Heaven!

Beginning this week, Fr. Hall and I will alternate our columns for the bulletin. So let me start with this Sunday's reflection:

As we draw closer to the end of the Church Calendar Year, our scripture readings invite us into a deeper reflection on the Second Coming of Christ and on the end of all time. Today's readings remind us to stop and take inventory of our lives. Where do we really stand before God? Are we praying at home with our families? Do our actions show the world that we are Christians? Are we faith-filled and hopeful people, even as the world experiences so much turmoil and fear? Are we so caught up in our own worries and concerns that we have forgotten that there will be a day of reckoning? Just as in business, an inventory is routinely needed to see how things are going and what needs to be done to ensure future success. Success for a Christian is eternal life with Jesus – the promise of heaven!

In today's gospel, Jesus reminded the people to be prepared: By your perseverance you will secure your lives. Our security in life rests in our faith in Christ and our willingness to care for others. Our safety is rooted in our relationship with our loving and faithful God. We attend Mass – we pray – we celebrate the Sacraments – we love one another. Through our perseverance we come to realize that we are so loved by God that we have been shown the way to everlasting happiness. Our journey of life may include suffering and difficult times but it is only a reminder that "we are not quite there yet" but we are getting closer. Through our perseverance, fear no longer controls our lives and we believe in the promises of our Lord, including the promise of heaven. With God at our side, a successful future is truly possible and we will always have eternal hope!
