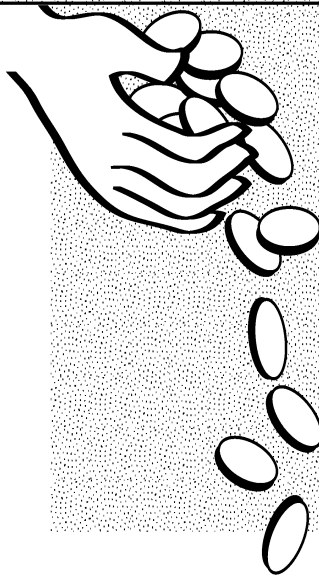
The Pharisees plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech.

Freedom is not the ability to do whatever we want; freedom is the power to do what is right, to always respect the truth and to choose life.

Belonging To God!

John Wesley once delivered a three-point sermon, in which his first point was, 'Get all you can.' To this, an old rich miser said, 'Amen.' Next, Wesley said, 'Keep all you can.' Again, the miser said, 'Amen.' Then the preacher said, 'Give all you can.' And the selfish man said, 'What a shame to spoil a good sermon.' (G. Fuller, OMI)

In today's gospel, the enemies of Jesus were trying to trap him with a question about paying taxes. He replies: *Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.* But what belongs to God? Our answer is found in today's scriptures. In our first reading from Isaiah, we are reminded that God is the creator of all that exists and, therefore, our praise, honor and glory belongs to God. In Thessalonians, our second reading, we discover that our faith, hope and love belong to God because of all that God has done for us. Isn't it comforting to know that God loves us and has chosen us to be his own? **We belong to God!** We are a blessed people!

And with a heart full of gratitude, I thank God for being blessed with young people in my life to make me laugh. Let me share something that happened not too long ago: A little boy was praying and ended a lengthy prayer that had included everyone he could think of by saying: "And Dear God, take care of yourself. If anything happens to you, we're all sunk." Think about it ... Really think about it. I believe that truer words were never spoken!

Next Sunday is World Mission Sunday, a time for Catholics to remember their many blessings by offering prayers and financial support for the work of the Church in the Missions. Our gospel reminds us that we are to use the goods of this world to further God's kingdom and keep our priorities straight about money. God has given us so much: abundant life, talents and abilities, financial treasure and all things we value. We have been given these gifts through God's generous love. As Christians, our lives should reflect our many blessings by sharing them with others. May our thoughts, words and deeds reflect our belief in this gospel message!
