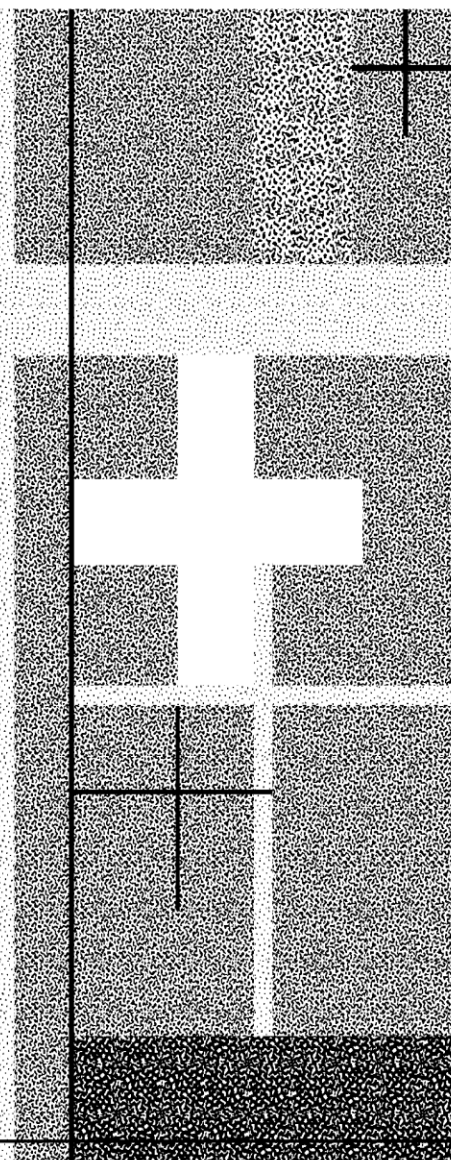
BAPTISM

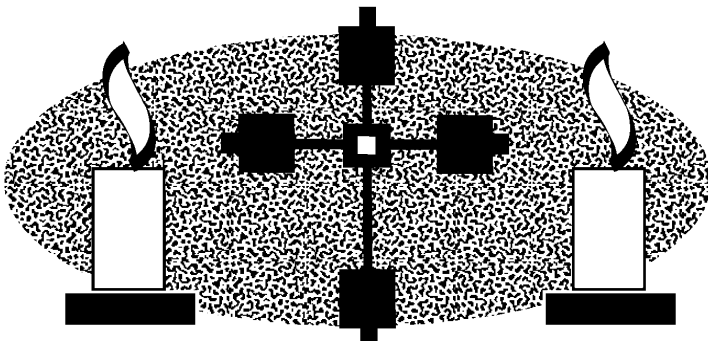

Priesthood Part I...

This year I celebrated my fifth year of ordination to the priesthood. It was a year marked with priest appreciation events at parishes that were very special to me. Many of you made mention of the fact that this is a special anniversary year for me. I am humbled by your attention to this small, but important milestone. Thank you all very much! I chose to mark the occasion of my fifth year of priesthood in a personal way by celebrating with other priests at a Mass for the profession of first vows for three religious sisters of the Handmaids of the Heart of Jesus at the Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in New Ulm. It was a way for me to celebrate, in a more ample way, the richness of the priesthood and religious life that brings the promise of hope Jesus offers us throughout the centuries and into the future with the promise of the New Evangelization toward which we are now advancing.

The identity of our Catholic parishes is intimately bound to the priesthood. As members of Christ's Holy Church we are united in the Eucharist. The priest acts in the person of Christ above all when offering the Eucharistic sacrifice (see Catechism of the Catholic Church 1552). The saving life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus is made actively present throughout the ages in a sacramental way in the Eucharistic liturgy so that the Church might become fully the body of Christ. The presence of Christ in the Eucharist is directed toward forming the true body of Christ which is the Church. Yves Congar once said: "the Eucharist makes the Church."

The priest stands in the middle of this "making" by virtue of his ordination. Being a priest is not a functionary role, it is a way of existing. I am a priest, I don't perform the priesthood. It means that I live out my call to the priesthood in a personal way. And since the person is always a relation, the priest always has a very special relationship with the Church. The priest is sacramentally empowered to represent Christ in a specific way as Bridegroom of the Church. When a man is ordained to the priesthood he becomes a sacramental sign of Christ in relation to the Church. My identity as a priest requires that I live as the bridegroom of the Church. And like a good bridegroom, it makes me happy to be faithful to her.
