

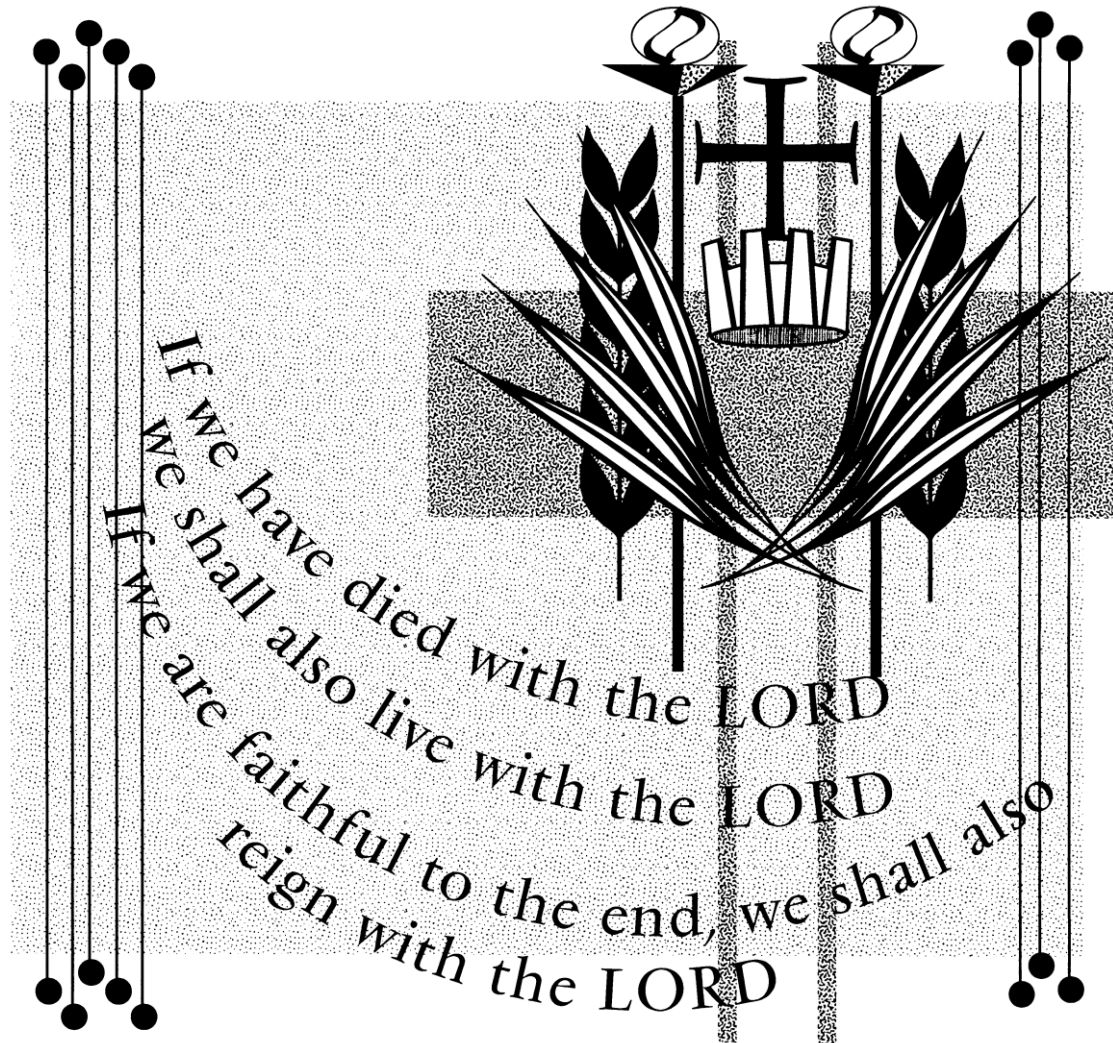
Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

About Our Children...

Last Sunday I gave what I characterize as an emphatic plea for more involvement in youth activities by our middle school and high school aged children. The message had an urgent tone attached to it because I care about the families that attend our parishes. I care about the children especially. They give me a lot of hope when I see them, and I want them to have every opportunity to rise to the potential of greatness which God has destined them in Christ Jesus.

Therefore, I continue to push for greater involvement in area and diocesan youth events. First off, I wish to draw your attention to our area middle school youth festival called "Made for More". It is a gathering for everyone in grades 6, 7 and 8. It will be October 17th from 12:30 PM to 6 PM. Participants must register soon. Secondly, I wish to strongly encourage our senior high students to consider participating in the Diocesan Catholic Youth Conference. It is scheduled to be in Rochester this year on the weekend of November 14th and 13th.

Please understand, I only want to give our youth a place where they are able to connect with the faith in their own way. These events, especially the big events like DCYC, are time tested and would not have flourished if young people were not attending them. Youth are attending these events in droves. Last summer there were nearly 2,000 attendees at the Steubenville North annual youth event in Rochester, yet only two participants were from our four parishes. Often children will tell their parents they do not want to go to these things, but when they go they have awesome experiences. This reality is nothing new to the parent-child rapport. I am certain that, out of responsible parenting, you make your children participate in many things that do not look appealing to them at first.
