

Sunny Sue

A sunflower pin doll

Materials

Scrap muslin for face
Scrap yellow batik fabric for petals
1 inch pin back
Scrap yellow felt
Prismacolor colored pencils
Micron or other permanent fabric pen
Pencil
Blush
Small silk or fiber flowers (about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter)
Small beads
Stuffing
Fabric Glue
Acrylic Matte Gloss Sealant



Head and Face

Trace around fabric template on doubled fabric and sew on line, leave open at top where indicated. Trim seams to 1/8 inch and turn right side out. Use a small amount of stuffing, keeping the head flat. Color the face using the prismacolor pencils. Apply blush to the cheeks and outline the eyes and add eyelashes with the micron or other fabric pen. Spray the face with acrylic matte gloss spray paint to seal.



Petals – Make 9

Trace around petal pattern on doubled fabric to make nine petals. Sew on line and leave open at the bottom. Cut out petals, leaving a 1/8 inch seam. Turn right side out. Make two stitches at the bottom of the petal to gather. Place the petals together into a rosette. Sew around the center of the rosette on both sides to secure.



Attaching

Attach the face to the petal rosette just underneath the face seam. Attach small silk or fabric flowers around the top of the head with a bead in the center.



Cut a 1 1/2 inch diameter felt circle and put two holes in the back for the head and foot of the pin back to go through. Use fabric glue and glue the felt on the back of the pin.



Your Sunny Sue pindoll is finished!
