I have discovered that by keeping busy doing something productive, I am able to accept the fact that I have to be here in prison.

As I realized that I was going to do some time (that is, after the initial shock was gone), I realized that it would be easier to justify my incarceration if I would do something positive. To make a difference not only in my life but in the life of at least one other person. Whether that person would be an inmate, a person on the outside, or anyone that the Lord would send my way. No matter who we are we can serve Him and make that ever-so-important difference.

I pray that with the budget crunch we will not have to give up the things that many of us take for granted. This may be in the way of education that allows many of the young men in here to walk away with something positive that they did not have when they were incarcerated.. Tools that may help them turn from the ways that brought them here in the first place.

If they take out education as well as cut some other programs, things such as our library or gym, may not be open as often. Where there may have been 7 employees, there now may be only 3, and if we do not have the officers or staff to over-see things we may be locked down more often.

I pray that the inmates do not come to the point of causing problems or even fight among themselves because they have too much time on our hands. We are all in this together and we must not allow the few trouble makers to make the majority suffer.

I pray that we all will do our best to get along and make the best of a bad situation. WE all are in the same boat and we must not allow anyone to rock the boat, it could very easily be sunk. In order for us to make things work, whether we're an inmate or staff member, the key word is "cooperate". No one promises us a rose garden. After all, this is prison and things could be worse.

Lets not push our luck to the point that we all spend time locked down like a caged animal. We all are adult men, or should be. There ought to be no reason that we should be on lock down.

I do not know if anyone else could see it. I saw how it took a great deal more staff to keep things going. That will not help in times when money is not there to operate. I feel that we all must be here, we should make the best of it.

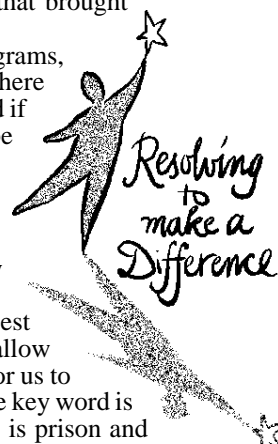
I hear so many men who say that they can't wait to get out and do the same thing that they were doing that brought them here. With these "war stories" they feel that they know that they did wrong and by not repeating it they will avoid being caught.

All that we can do is pray that their eyes will be opened and they will be able to see beyond the obstacles that Satan put between us and the truth. We need to be able to set a positive example that there is a better way to live. That way includes having Jesus as our Lord and savior. I believe in giving credit where credit is due. When we recently had a problem on the yard with fighting, I believe that warden Burt and the staff acted professionally as well as with the best interests of all that were involved whether they were an inmate or staff.

Warden Burt could very easily have locked the inmate population down for an extended time. We could have lost many of the privileges we normally have. Instead of being locked down for a few days, we could have been locked down for 30 to 90 days.

I firmly believe that the decisions that Warden Burt makes reflects the fact that he not only understands the concerns of the inmate but cares about the inmates that are in his charge. I hope that this gives you something to think about. Go in peace serve the Lord.

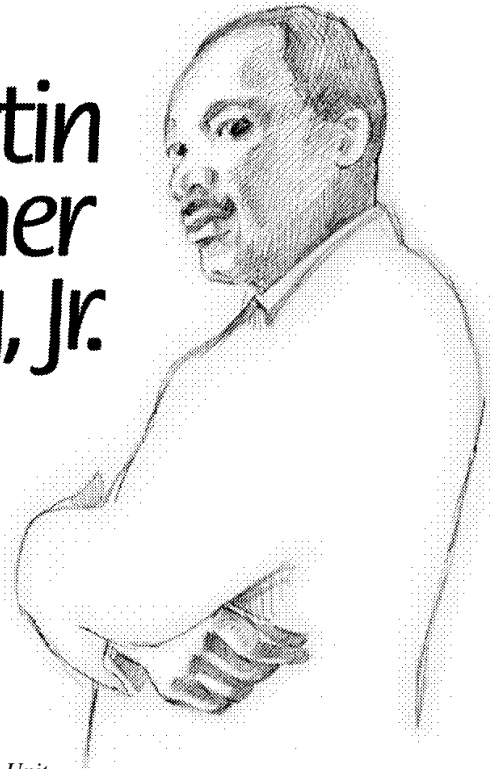

A Positive Thought

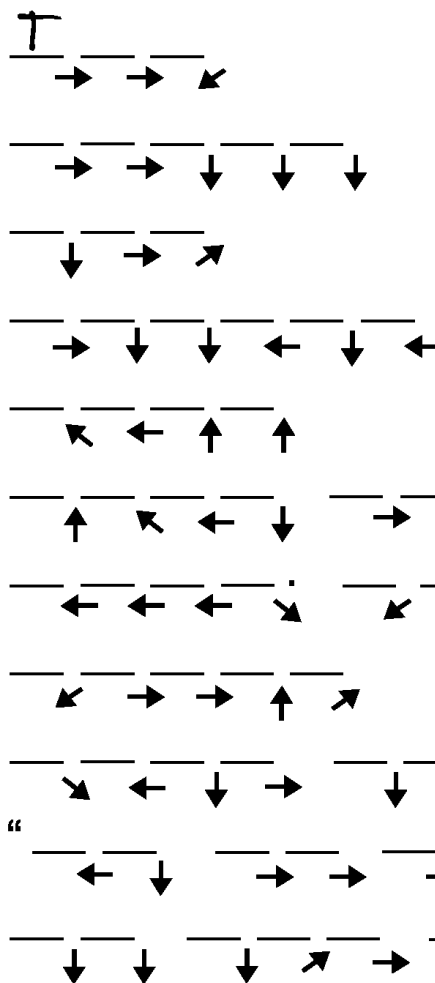
If God had a refrigerator, your picture

safe from worldly harm

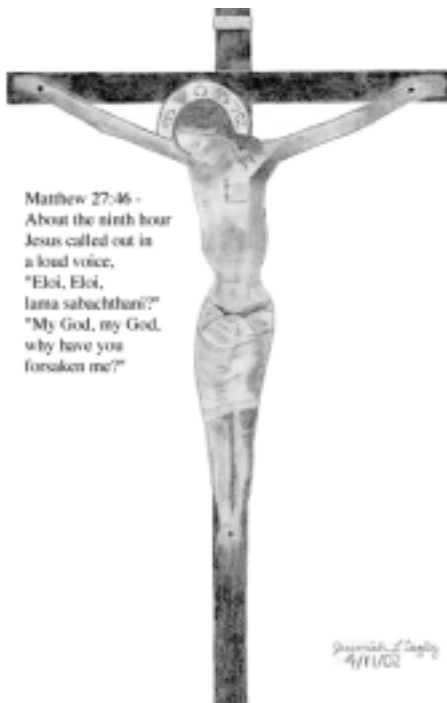
As I take each step
