The American Veterans Traveling Tribute (AVTT) is a mobile group of memorials and exhibits, anchored by an 80 percent reproduction of the Vietnam Memorial Wall including all of the names included on the original.



The AVTT honors the men and women who made the ultimate

sacrifice to ensure American freedom as well as those who served their country from World War II through the Iraq and Afghanistan conflict. A special 9/11 memorial also is included and a large art display; Vietnam Remembered and a Walk of Heroes' display also accompanies AVTT. The 370-foot long replica of the Vietnam Memorial Wall reproduction stands 8-feet tall at its apex, and does not leave out a single name featured on the original in Washington D.C.

Don Allen, a retired U.S. Army Special Forces Lt. Col., and several other veterans, formed the AVTT in 1997 and the exhibits began touring in 1998. Along with its role as a memorial, the AVTT also serves the purpose of offering those who cannot, or will not make the journey to Washington D.C. a chance to visit the Vietnam Memorial Wall.

The memorial is a tribute to all who stood up for America and an opportunity for our community and our youth to better understand those who sacrificed their lives, and support all who have served and are currently serving.

Nearly every weekend of the year, except for occasional down time needed for maintenance, the AVTT is set up somewhere in the U.S., informing and educating people about the cost of freedom and honoring those who made it.

It is the duty and mission of the AVTT that those who served SHALL never be forgotten.
