FROM FATHER STAN

Happy Easter! Today we get to celebrate what is on the other side of any pain, loss and fear. May the Easter joy be yours throughout the year, for indeed Jesus is risen!

It has been my privilege to travel to the Holy Land a number of times, and to spend a semester there as a student. A most sacred place is the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. A sepulcher, as you know, is a tomb. This massive church covers Golgotha, the rock outcrop where Jesus was crucified, as well as the tomb in which he was laid. In the close confines of the tomb area, prayer comes easily. It is not only where Jesus was buried, but also the site of the resurrection, in which we put all our hope. Much of the world, in fact, calls the church not the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, but the Church of the Anastasis, that is the Church of the Resurrection.

On one visit, at our very last stop we celebrated Mass within the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. A few hours later we were at the airport on our way home. But at this final Mass, we were celebrating the end of our pilgrimage in the same place that Jesus seemed to end his pilgrimage. Perhaps fifty yards from Calvary we had Mass – which is about the sacrifice of Jesus, his death. But it is also about his resurrection, and we were about thirty yards from the tomb, which received the body of Jesus, and from which the Risen Christ emerged. In the chapel where we had Mass, there was a replica of the Shroud of Turin on the wall. The Shroud of Turin is venerated as the linen in which the body of Jesus was wrapped. It is a sign of the wrappings left behind, never to be needed again, when Jesus rose from the dead. While Jesus died in Jerusalem, he also rose there. While the pilgrimage of his ministry ended there, it also had its new beginning there. While our group ended our time in Israel there, it didn't end our pilgrimage either. We are all called to follow him to Galilee, and beyond.

And so we begin the Easter season, lasting fifty days, until Pentecost. The Easter season is longer than Lent; we feast longer than we fast, for we are people who encounter the Risen Christ. No one on earth has ever seen Jesus dead, as he was on the cross, and as he was put in the tomb. We encounter only the Risen Christ. Let us help each other know Him too.

Dear St. Pius V and St. Joseph parish community, friend, and visitors,


In this year of St. Matthew, I pray this Easter season becomes the occasion to remember what God has done for all of us in Jesus Christ. For the forty days in



Lent, we have experienced Jesus as the forgiving and reconciling presence of God among us. In the person of Jesus Christ, God is constantly calling us out of darkness into his own wonderful light. God desires us to live in freedom; freedom from the temptation to place one's security and hope in life on material things; freedom from the temptation to power, to place one's trust in the ability to control and manipulate people and circumstances in life, and finally freedom from the temptation to self-righteousness, to think that somehow through my own way of praying and doing spirituality I can guarantee God's favors and blessings. In Jesus Christ we are free people, for only in Jesus Christ, both men and women can live with each other in peace and Justice.

Brothers and sisters, in this year of St. Matthew, let us remember God's promise to us, as St Paul tell us, that in Jesus' dying and rising to life we are a new creation. May the liturgy of the Church become the occasion and opportunity for us to witness God's love and freedom to the world, and in doing so become everything that God has intended us to be. Happy Easter!

Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

Easter symbols are all about life. The lilies that bloom radiate living beauty. Easter eggs symbolize the life the breaks out of the tomb. The Easter candle burns brightly as a sign that light conquers darkness, a light that brings life to all. Water is needed by every living thing. Even secular symbols like rabbits and chicks point to abundant life-recall the phrase, "they multiply like rabbits," used to describe a proliferation of life.

The cross that graces so many Easter cards as well as the Easter candle itself, also reminds us that Easter is about death-and transformation. The symbols of life have within themselves the power of death. The lily gives up its bloom and the plant dies back retreating into the bulb that nourished it. The egg pours out its life and the shell is left behind. The fire that is contained in the Easter candle can just as easily roar into a refining conflagration. Water, which all life needs, can also destroy. And the cross at its inception was an instrument of death and hardly a symbol of life.

This is the hard truth of the Easter message. Life comes at a price, and eternal life at the costliest price of all: the death of the only-begotten Son. Christ's death brings life, and is so radically transformative that even the very instrument of his death is seen today as a sign of life for all. The newly baptized are sealed with a cross of chrism on their forehead, a fragrant transformation of the ashes that graced us all at the beginning of Lent. The newly baptized died to sin in the bath of water and rose to life in Christ, and the rest of us renewed our baptismal commitment to follow Christ faithfully through life. This Easter day is a celebration and a commitment, a promise to leave the past behind and to walk in the newness of life.
