

FROM FATHER STAN

We are into May – perhaps the rain systems will pause for farmers to get into the field and for us all to enjoy the sunshine and being outdoors. Please make plans to purchase a ticket for yourself or someone else to attend the music festival on Friday, May 16, and, if you are going, also volunteer at the



music festival. We still need people in a number of areas – selling beverages, scanning ids, putting on wrist bands, etc. Most are 2-hour shifts for the roughly six-hour event.

May is also the month of Mary. One reason is because the feast of the Visitation on May 31st, set there so it falls between the Annunciation (March 25) and the Birth of John the Baptist (June 24). Another reason is that in the northern hemisphere so many things are bursting into bloom during May, and Mary gave birth to the one who brings life.

May is also a special time, along with October, for the rosary. Millions of people pray the rosary daily. It has been a practice of mine for about eight years. Here are some of the approaches I take to praying the rosary: First of all, I see it as a tool for meditation. I don't necessarily focus on each Hail Mary, although I do want to be aware I'm saying that prayer. I focus more on the decade as a whole, and the particular mystery designated. I try to ask myself what this meant for Jesus, for Mary, and for me and what I am doing that day. For example, in the Joyful mysteries, for the first decade I might ask, "What is God announcing to me today? What I am I tell others? How will that change my life, how do I say 'yes' to it?" Second decade: "To whom do I take that? Who do I visit to gain understanding and strength in my faith?" Third decade: "What will this give birth to in our communities or in my ministry, life, etc.?" Fourth decade: "How might I present this to others? Who is rejoicing over the news of Jesus in our midst? What do they tell me?" Fifth: "What am I anxious about? Come to understand you will find Jesus just where he is supposed to be."

Another example: The sorrowful mysteries: The Agony in the Garden – which is really about preparing for difficult things, and gaining the confidence from our prayer that God will help us through those things. Sometimes I will pray for those who farm, or garden, and the anxieties they have that day/season. Scourging at the Pillar: Who is being scourged today? Who is being tried in the newspaper, who is being belittled in our community? Or, who is having invasive medical issues – receiving chemo, dialysis, surgery, affected by noise or pain? Crowing of Thorns: who has

accepted a difficult position of authority? I often pray for Pope Francis, Archbishop Nienstedt, the other bishops, Fr. Lachowitzer, the vicar general; for the President or Congress, state legislators, judges and peace officers, city council members – an often thankless job, parish council members. You can see I usually run out of Hail Mary before the list is exhausted. The way of the cross: Here I often go through the first 10 stations, trying to connect with each station. I continue this for the fifth mystery, the crucifixion, spending more Hail Marys on the 12th station as Jesus is on the cross and dies.

I find this way of praying takes me out of rattling through the prayer as fast as I can and makes it something that rests or refreshes me, opens me to more people and deeper understanding of the various mysteries of our faith. The luminous and glorious mysteries have more specific theological themes – baptism, Eucharist, Transfiguration, Assumption, Resurrection, Ascension, the Holy Spirit. Somewhat frequent reflection on these helps us understand and appreciate the many parts of our faith more.

As the Faith Formation season ends for our youth, I want to thank the Catechists for their time and effort in educating our children in the faith. This is a time-consuming volunteer position. It requires dedication, coming each week; preparation and often patience. Thank you! I hope everyone appreciates this gift to each parish.

On May 3rd, this Saturday, the GROW pastoral planning team from each parish will be meeting in Farmington for a 6-hour session where we write the details of our plan for preserving and improving our parishes. All the pieces more toward helping to evangelize. We look at how we pray, study, offer hospitality and at our generosity. These things can and will be expressed in our liturgies and personal spiritual growth; education for adults and youth and all that goes into that formation; how we welcome and reach out in our communities, whether our facilities and programs meet the needs of our area; and how generous we are financially and personally. Along with the plan will be a series of 60-day implementation phases. We've already started some things, such as Masses where youth have numerous roles, adult education classes, and some changes in providing drafts of parish council notes shortly after meetings rather than wait until they are approved two months later and posting them on the internet. They will still be on our websites, but a few hard copies at church as well.

The monthly meeting for PULSE is Monday, May 5, 7:00-8:30 pm in the youth room.


