We Are the Champions

At the end of June, I participated in the annual Kaposia Day parade in South Saint Paul. When I bought my white 2002 Mustang convertible last year, unbeknownst to me, there was an expectation that I would be showing it off in the parade. Well, needless to say that that did not happen. This year, I had our organist, Lori Lencowski set things up and had our trustee, Tom Boser and his printing company make a magnetic sign with the Saint John Vianney logo on it. Tom asked me what the sign should say. I told him to put on it “Church of Saint John Vianney: Champion of South St. Paul Churches.” I had my car and the passengers it adorned with my vast collection of professional wrestling championship belts.



Superficially, yes, one can see that I am giving the other churches in town the needle. But I would hope folks would delve deeper to see some more profound meaning in our call to be Church. After all, what is a champion? The way I see it, a champion is one who puts his or her entire being in striving to be the very best. When it comes to being Church, when it comes to be a disciple of Jesus, we know that God calls us to be our very best in His name: to be a champion of the Word, to be a champion of the sacraments; to our Catholic faith, to be a champion of His will, to be a champion of spreading His love to all we encounter.

We must continually ask ourselves the question “how have I been a champion for God today?” Champions in sports strive for perfection or excellence with practice. How well have we practiced our faith? Champions in sports strive for perfection or excellence with study: studying the playbook, studying their opponents on film, studying themselves on film discerning on how they can improve their game. If we are to be champions for God, we must be committed to that same kind of study: studying our Catholic playbook in both the sacred scripture and our tradition through the catechism of the Catholic Church. We study how we can apply this faith to a society that may not accept our teachings. We study ourselves through self-examination to acknowledge that there is always room for improvement and reconciliation.

God is calling us. Can we honestly say: “We are the champions?”—TB

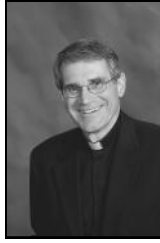

Report from Oil City, PA: Nineteen people from our 5-parishes and twenty-two from SEAS in Hastings made the bus trip to the Catholic Heart Work Camp in Oil City. We met other groups from Virginia, Michigan, Illinois and Pennsylvania, and the nearly 200 of us were formed into 28 groups that did work at about 40 homes. All were



construction or yard jobs – clearing trees and weeds, painting, rebuilding porches, repairing drywall and sidewalks, those sorts of things. We made a significant impact on the community. Both the (Erie diocese) bishop and bishop emeritus came to visit and assist with confessions one night. The mayor stopped by to thank us, and on the final night residents we helped reported how important it was to them, and how it gave them hope. We were also on the front and back pages of the first section of the local paper, with five pictures.

The trip was well-planned, and done in an economical way. We were able to stay at a church for (next to) nothing. We brought the food to eat on the trip – riders were told to bring no money, which is rather counter-cultural. We had plenty of snacks and things to eat. Once we arrived at the site, we had team building exercises, and instruction on painting and a few other things. The day began with campers rising at 6:15. Breakfast at 6:30, Mass at 7:30 or so, and some other programming. We picked up the tools and supplies we would need, packed the lunches and picked up prayer sheets for the day. The goal was to arrive on site by 9:00 a.m. and work until 3:00 or a bit later. Back at the site there were showers, dinner at 5:00 and program at 7:00-9:00. The program included music, some frivolity, pictures from the various work sites, and then transition into a quieter, more reflective time of music and prayer, and perhaps a witness from a team member. One night we had Eucharistic adoration, another night was “4 Corners” of peace, healing, faith and reconciliation, where campers could go to confession and also talk to adults about faith questions or seeking peace or healing. The final night residents came to thank us for our work. After this, we would meet for about 45 minutes in our own youth groups, then about 30 minutes of recreation, then prepare for bed at 10:30 followed by lights out at 11:00. It was a very enriching and productive experience. I hope we have substantial representation from each parish next year. In the coming few weeks we will decide where we hope to go next year. Leading possibilities are Kansas City or St. Louis.

In the meantime, I hope to start an 8-hour version of this in our communities. I'd like to have a few crews of teenagers with some adults take on an exterior and interior job of some sort. Youth are generally excited to learn a new skill, and it might lead to going on mission themselves.

This has been another week with much news about the sex abuse scandal in the Archdiocese. Not so much as new

allegations against priests, but an hour-long report by MPR about Archbishops Roach, Flynn and Nienstedt and their handling of cases, and a 107-page affidavit by the former chancellor of canonical affairs Jennifer Haselberger describing her experiences and her perception of the process of dealing with such cases continue to raise concerns about how things have been handled in the past, and, by implication, even today. It continues to be challenging to operate in such an environment. It is frustrating to go through such delicacies of making sure there is always a second adult in a car, for example, when larger things are mishandled. I do ask your prayers for anyone affected by the scandal. I think of those who were molested first, and for those who have lost faith in the leadership, and thereby in the whole institution of the Church and even any organized religion. We all lose in those cases. Some people are mentioned who are perhaps not guilty. Those at the Archdiocese who have to work their way through this mess or try to do unrelated work are challenged by the toxic work environment. I do think that most people are most affected by what happens in their own parish. I'm grateful that our three parishes seem to have a complete bill of health as far as that goes. If I am wrong about that, please let me know, or report it to the proper authorities in the county or the police. I'm thankful for all the support our parishes and I receive personally. We are doing good things here.

The fiscal year ended June 30th. All three parishes completed the year in good financial shape. We are spending a significant amount in on repairs/improvements at St. Mary, so we might dip into savings there, but that has been planned for some time. In the other two parishes we finished in substantially in the black. At St. John's we are doing some building repairs, partly for our Centennial on October 26, but also just because we need to keep maintaining buildings. But we have also been able to begin a small endowment for our school (\$50,000) while keeping a cushion in the checkbook and dedicating some money to a maintenance reserve for future projects (re-leading windows, floor maintenance, and other projects as they arise.) At St. Mathias we will repair the church steps, and a few smaller projects. We will also begin a process of considering a new building for education and possibly other purposes. That process will be very deliberative.

July 26 is the feast of Joachim and Anna. Who are they and what do we know about them?

A

Joachim and Anna are the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus, yet there is absolutely no biblical reference to them whatsoever. So where do we get their names, and what is their story?

Their names are found in an apocryphal (hidden) gospel known as "The Infancy Gospel of James." Apocryphal, or hidden gospels, consist of accounts of Jesus' life that were ultimately not accepted as inspired works, and thus were not included in the Bible. However, they sometimes captured the Christian imagination, spilling into the devotional dimension of the community.

James' infancy gospel begins with the parents of Mary and their desire for a child. In their prayer and petitions to God, they are heard and given the blessings of a child, whom they named Mary. While we have no idea who Mary's parents really were, the fact that we celebrate the feast of Joachim and Anna indicates that the bond of family love is important in the Christian life.

Long before Grandparents' Day was established, the church had a feast that honored the presumed grandparents of Jesus. While their names are part of non-inspired apocryphal legends, the fact of the Savior's human ancestry is not. Christ, the incarnate Word, dwelt among us in the flesh in a human family. In honoring the grandparents of Jesus we really proclaim our faith in the Incarnation—God becoming human!

At our parish council meeting this week, we considered various ways we might be more visible in the community. We hope to do so at the community events already scheduled, but also at a series (perhaps three) of ice-cream events in various neighborhoods. I'll be asking people to host such events. We are also planning a series of community education events over the next few years, including such items as mental health, home maintenance, job skills, financial skills such as how to budget or how to read a balance sheet. Initially we will do one of these every two months. We'll add more if the response is good.

My apologies for failing to have someone preside at Mass on Saturday, July 5. I don't know exactly how that happened, but it was my error. My apologies especially to the Karnick and Lucking families who had intentions scheduled for that Mass.

Work on the plaster repair and painting of the east and west walls will have concluded by the time you read this. While there will have been some clean-up, it would also be a good time to plan a thorough cleaning prior to our Centennial in October. We have not been able to sustain an effective cleaning process in the past few years. It may be time to hire someone to do this – carpets and pews, various dusting, that sort of thing on a weekly or bi-monthly basis. Consider it – we'll establish a pay rate soon.

We have established an endowment for our school through the Catholic Community Foundation. It will be called the St. John the Baptist (Vermillion MN) School Endowment Fund. It is established with a value of \$50,000, which was obtained by the gift of \$20,000 from a non-parishioner last fall, and matched by our parishioners for a total of \$43,000. We added a CD that was earning very little for us, and rounded it up to the minimum \$50,000 amount. This will give us at least \$2,000 for the school this next year. I hope that over the years this is added to by bequests or savings and becomes a significant fund to ensure the future of our school.

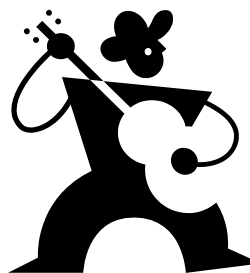
