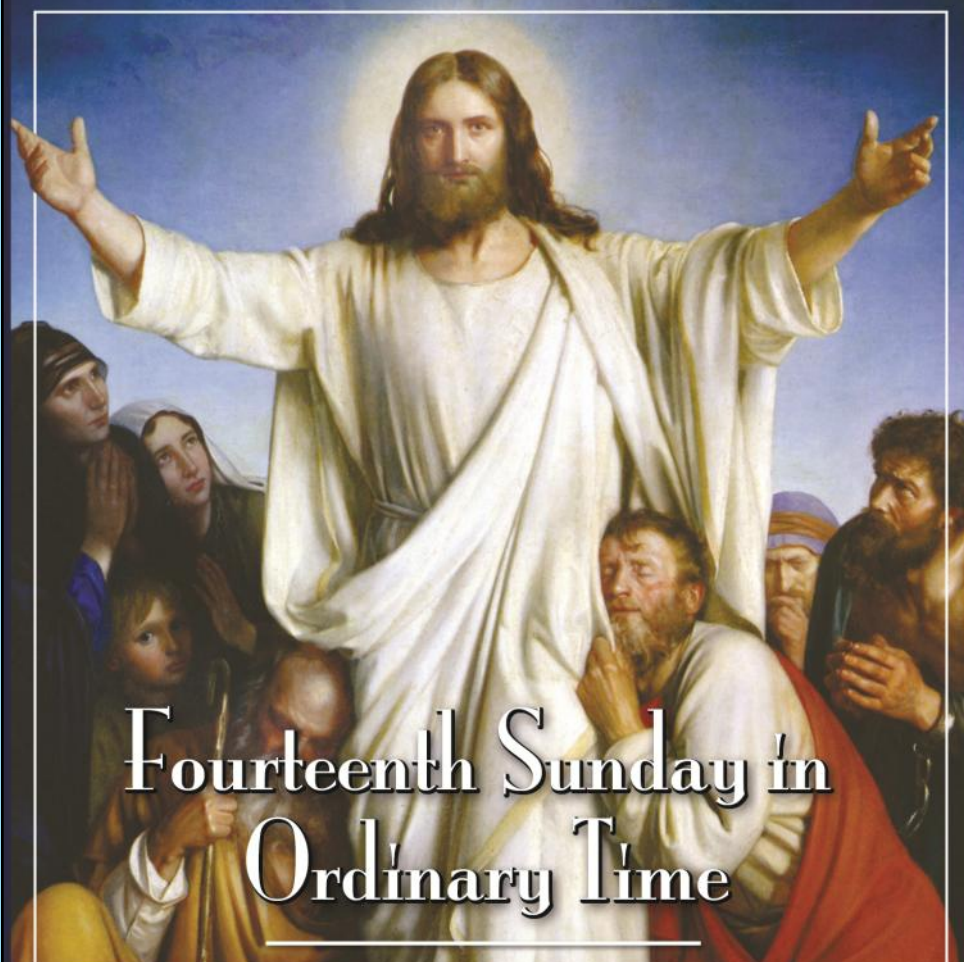

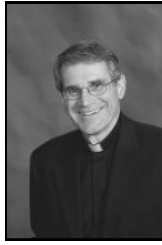

The Fourth of July weekend concludes the “Fortnight for Freedom” which is becoming an annual awareness effort about religious liberties in the United States. It typically begins with the feast days of St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher, who were martyred in 1535 by order of King Henry VIII primarily because they would not go along with the events that led to the establishment of the Church of England under the leadership of the king rather than the Pope. Thomas More, as you may recall from the movie and play “A Man for All Seasons” was the chancellor in the king’s court – something like chief of staff or secretary of state. John Fisher was the bishop of Rochester (England) and while imprisoned, was named to the College of Cardinals. Their struggle for freedom to practice their faith in all matters remains in very significant ways in many countries, including to some degree in the United States, hence, the “Fortnight for Freedom.”



In the past week the Supreme Court made a few decisions that upheld some narrow interpretations of that religious liberty. I haven’t studied these carefully, but this is what I understand: One involved allowing people to continue to practice their faith in what is generally called sidewalk counseling. People will continue to provide materials and engage in gentle but serious conversation regarding choosing or not choosing an abortion while remaining at a specified distance from places where abortions are performed. A second case involved allowing small businesses, narrowly held (i.e., owned by only a few people who agree on certain issues, usually family run businesses) to provide health care for their employees that do not include some treatments they find goes against their religion. The concern was the Affordable Care Act’s Health and Human Services (HHS) mandate that they supply their employees insurance coverage which provided access to at least 20 types of contraceptives, including “four contraceptive methods at issue” that are abortifacients. The court determined that the company would not have to provide insurance that covered these four items that the business owner found went against their religious belief that life begins at conception. The challenge remains to find a health care package that will provide coverage within those parameters. This case does not settle some other questions involving religious orders and other Church related institutions.

We have several new pastors in our deanery. As was announced last weekend, Fr. Terry Beeson will be the new pastor of St. Pius V in Cannon Falls and St. Joseph in Miesville. I’m sure there are plans to distribute a biography about him in those parishes. In short, he was ordained in 2005, and most recently was pastor of St. John Vianney in South Saint Paul. He has an expansive personality, and I’m sure you’ll meet him soon. I understand he starts around July 15th.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Hastings also has a new pastor, Fr. David Hennen. He is a native of Watkins, Minnesota. He was also ordained in 2005, and was first assigned as an associate at Epiphany parish in Coon Rapids, and has been pastor of St. Francis Xavier in Buffalo since 2008. Father Hennen has a bachelor’s degree in computer science from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. Father Hennen was honored to have been chosen to serve as the Minnesota State Senate chaplain from 2010-2011.

I would also like to thank Fr. Ortega and Fr. Pirkl (of SEAS in Hastings) for their ministry in our deanery. I got to work closely with Fr. Ortega in the many collaborative efforts of our combined five parishes. I know parishioners have been grateful for how well he worked with young people, and for his pastoral nature at funerals and other difficult times. I appreciated working with him. Fr. Pirkl was pastor of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton for 12 years, the maximum usually allowed. He will be going to Mary, Mother of the Church in Burnsville, another large parish, but with no full-time associate. There is no school there, so that will be a different experience for him as well. I appreciated Fr. Pirkl’s insights at meetings and support in areas where we collaborated, such as the NET ministry teams embedded in our parishes in the past. The associate pastor in Hastings, Fr. Cole Kracke, will continue there. As dean, it will be my privilege to install the new pastors in their parishes in the coming months.

This week 20 of us from the five-parish area, along with 22 from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Hastings, are on a mission trip to Oil City, Pennsylvania. We will return late Saturday night. Please check the Mass schedule for this week carefully – there will be one Mass in each of the three parishes during the week. Confessions on Saturday only.

Thank you to Fr. Jim Gorman for covering the Masses here this weekend. Fr. Jim was pastor of St. John the Baptist in Vermillion from 1990-92.

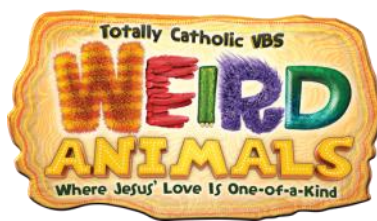

With Fr. Stan on the mission trip this week, there will be Mass on Monday, but not Friday.

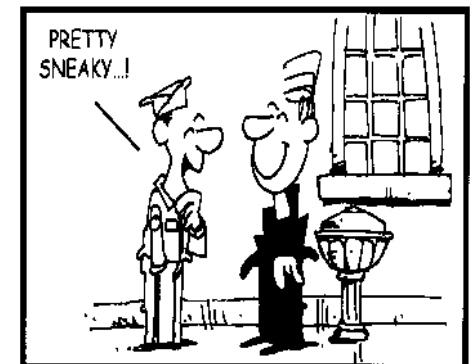
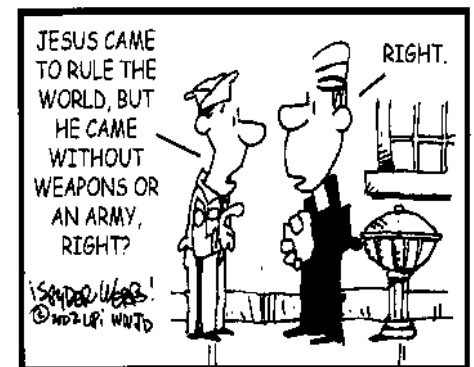

Work continues in the painting and plaster repair. You should be able to see some work has been done along north and south part of the walls around the larger windows, and painting has been done in the sanctuary. Much work has been done in the sacristy as well. In addition, we've taken advantage of the equipment available and have had dust blown down from various ledges and the statuary above the tabernacle. Work has gone well so far, so we have asked for a final bid to do similar work along the rest of the arches, on the east and west walls. Along with painting the doors and various other woodwork, we are making some significant steps in repairing and sprucing up things on the inside of the church. There is much more that can or should be addressed in the next years: redoing the remaining 10, smaller, stained glass windows (a little over \$100,000), refurbishing the floor, new carpet in the sanctuary, updating the kitchen, and possibly other things. In addition, soon you will see some repair and reroofing from the hail storm last summer. This will affect the gathering area roof, and some work on the rectory and convent. Most of this roof work is covered by insurance.

More next week on the establishment of an endowment for our school.

With Fr. Stan on the mission trip this week, there will be on Wednesday, but not Tuesday. No confessions Tuesday, either.

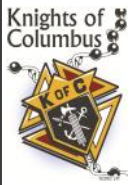
Master Gardeners Give Tips on Harvesting, Preserving Vegetables
